## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the Texas Funeral Service Commission and the regulation
- 3 of funeral directing and embalming.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 651.001(14), Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:

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- 7 (14) "Provisional license holder" means a person who:
- 8 (A) is engaged in learning the practice of
- 9 funeral directing or embalming under the instruction, direction,
- 10 and [personal] supervision of a funeral director or embalmer; and
- 11 (B) holds a provisional license issued by the
- 12 commission under this chapter.
- SECTION 2. Section 651.054(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (a) Members of the commission serve staggered six-year
- 16 terms, with the terms of one-third of the members expiring in each
- 17 odd-numbered year. [A member may not be appointed for more than one
- 18 full term, except that a member appointed to fill an unexpired term
- 19 with less than three years remaining in the unexpired term may be
- 20 reappointed to the commission for one full term.
- 21 SECTION 3. Section 651.253(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 (a) To be eligible for a funeral director's license or an
- 24 embalmer's license, an applicant must:

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- 1 (1) be at least 18 years of age;
- 2 (2) have graduated from an accredited high school or
- 3 passed an examination prescribed by the Texas Education Agency;
- 4 (3) have graduated from an accredited school or
- 5 college of mortuary science;
- 6 (4) unless the applicant holds a reciprocal embalmer's
- 7 license, have served as a provisional license holder for not less
- 8 than one year under the [personal] supervision and instruction of a
- 9 funeral director or embalmer, as applicable; and
- 10 (5) have successfully completed the applicable
- 11 written examination described by Section 651.255 or 651.256.
- 12 SECTION 4. Section 651.301, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 13 read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 651.301. PROVISIONAL LICENSE REQUIRED. A person must
- 15 obtain a provisional license before the person may engage in
- 16 learning the practice of funeral directing or embalming under the
- 17 instruction, direction, and [personal] supervision in this state of
- 18 a licensed funeral director or embalmer.
- 19 SECTION 5. Section 651.302, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- Sec. 651.302. APPLICATION; ISSUANCE OF PROVISIONAL
- 22 LICENSE. (a) The commission shall issue a provisional license to
- 23 practice funeral directing to an applicant who:
- 24 (1) is at least 18 years of age;
- 25 (2) either:
- 26 (A) has completed the educational requirements
- 27 of Section 651.253 or is enrolled in an accredited school or college

- 1 of mortuary science; or
- 2 (B)  $\left[\frac{(3)}{(3)}\right]$  is employed by a funeral director to
- 3 learn funeral directing or embalming under the instruction and
- 4 supervision of the funeral director;
- 5 (3)  $\left[\frac{4}{4}\right]$  files an application for a provisional
- 6 license on a form provided by the commission and verified under oath
- 7 by the applicant; and
- 8 (4)  $[\frac{(5)}{}]$  pays any required application or license
- 9 fee.
- 10 (b) The commission shall issue a provisional license to
- 11 practice embalming to an applicant who:
- 12 (1) is at least 18 years of age;
- 13 (2) either:
- 14 (A) has completed the educational requirements
- of Section 651.253 or is enrolled in an accredited school or college
- 16 of mortuary science; or
- 17 (B) is employed by an embalmer to learn embalming
- 18 under the instruction and supervision of the embalmer;
- 19 (3) files an application for a provisional license;
- 20 (4) pays any required application or license fee; and
- 21 (5) complies with the requirements of this chapter and
- 22 of the commission.
- SECTION 6. Sections 651.303(b) and (c), Occupations Code,
- 24 are amended to read as follows:
- 25 (b) The commission by rule shall define the terms of
- 26 employment of a provisional license holder. The terms of
- 27 employment must include service by the provisional license holder

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- 1 under actual working conditions and under the [personal]
- 2 supervision of a funeral director or embalmer.
- 3 (c) The term of the provisional license program must be at
- 4 least 12 consecutive months but not more than 36 [24] consecutive
- 5 months.
- 6 SECTION 7. Sections 651.305(d) and (e), Occupations Code,
- 7 are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (d) If the renewal fee and penalty are not paid before the
- 9 91st day after the date of the notice of suspension, the commission
- 10 shall cancel the license. [If the license is canceled under this
- 11 subsection, the provisional license holder may apply for
- 12 reinstatement not later than 18 months after the date of
- 13 cancellation. The commission may reinstate the canceled license
- 14 <del>if:</del>
- [(1) all other commission requirements are satisfied;
- 16 <del>and</del>
- 17 [(2) the license fee and a late payment penalty equal
- 18 to the amount of the license fee for the period of the cancellation
- 19 are paid.
- 20 (e) A provisional license may be renewed after the third
- 21 [second] anniversary of the date of its issuance only if the person
- 22 requests and receives from the commission an extension based on
- 23 hardship.
- SECTION 8. Section 651.306, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- Sec. 651.306. [PERSONAL] SUPERVISION OF PROVISIONAL
- 27 LICENSE HOLDER. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a

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- 1 provisional license holder may practice only under the personal
- 2 <u>supervision of a funeral director or embalmer</u>. For the purposes of
- 3 this chapter, personal supervision requires the physical presence
- 4 of a funeral director or embalmer at the specified place and time a
- 5 funeral service is provided.
- 6 (b) After a provisional license holder has practiced under
- 7 the personal supervision of a funeral director or embalmer for at
- 8 <u>least six months</u>, the funeral director or embalmer under whom the
- 9 provisional license holder is training may submit to the commission
- 10 an affidavit of proficiency for the provisional license holder. If
- 11 the commission approves the affidavit of proficiency, the
- 12 provisional license holder may practice under the general
- 13 <u>supervision of a funeral director or embalmer.</u> The funeral
- 14 director or embalmer supervising the provisional license holder
- 15 shall determine the appropriate manner of providing general
- 16 <u>supervision of the provisional license holder.</u>
- 17 SECTION 9. Section 651.060(b), Occupations Code, is
- 18 repealed.
- 19 SECTION 10. Section 651.302, Occupations Code, as amended
- 20 by this Act, applies only to a person who files an application for a
- 21 provisional license on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 22 person who files an application before the effective date of this
- 23 Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the application is
- 24 filed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 25 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
