(a) 7 The commission shall establish and maintain a training program for employees of a school district or open-enrollment charter school 8 who hold a license to carry a concealed handgun issued under 9 Subchapter H, Chapter 411, Government Code, and who are authorized 10 under Section 37.0811, Education Code, to attend the training 11 12 program. The training program may be conducted only by the commission staff or by other agencies and institutions the 13 14 commission approves for that purpose. 15 (b) The training program must: 16 (1) consist of not more than 20 hours of training; and 17 (2) include instruction in: (A) defensive techniques; and 18 19 (B) safely handling a firearm in a public 20 setting. 21 (c) The commission shall issue a certification to each person the commission determines has successfully completed the 22 23 training program. 24 (d) The commission shall charge each participant in the training program a reasonable fee to cover the cost to the 25 26 commission of conducting the program. 27 (e) A certification issued under this section expires on the

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second anniversary of the date of issuance. A person may renew a 1 2 certification by complying with any requirements established by the 3 commission. 4 (f) The commission shall submit, for each person issued a 5 certification under this section, the name and date of birth of the person, the license number of the license issued to the person under 6 7 Subchapter H, Chapter 411, Government Code, and the address of the person's place of employment to: 8 9 (1) the director of the Department of Public Safety; (2) the school district or open-enrollment charter 10 school by which the person is employed; 11 12 (3) the chief law enforcement officer of the local municipal law enforcement agency if the person is employed at a 13 14 campus of a school district or open-enrollment charter school 15 located within a municipality; 16 (4) the sheriff of the county if the person is employed 17 at a campus of a school district or open-enrollment charter school that is not located within a municipality; and 18 19 (5) a peace officer commissioned under Section 37.081, Education Code, if the person is employed at a school district that 20 has commissioned a peace officer under that section. 21 (g) The commission shall immediately report the expiration 22 of a certification to the persons or entities listed in Subsection 23 24 (f). (h) Identifying information about a person collected or 25 26 submitted under this section is confidential, except as provided by Subsection (f), and is not subject to disclosure under Chapter 552, 27

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1 Government Code.

2 SECTION 3. The Commission on Law Enforcement Officer 3 Standards and Education shall establish the firearm training 4 program as required by Section 1701.260, Occupations Code, as added 5 by this Act, not later than January 1, 2014.

6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
