A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to a limit on state reimbursement to public institutions
- 3 of higher education for debt service on tuition revenue bonds.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 55, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 55.185 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 55.185. LIMIT ON STATE REIMBURSEMENT FOR DEBT SERVICE.
- 8 (a) In this section, "institution of higher education" has the
- 9 meaning assigned by Section 61.003.
- 10 (b) The legislature may not appropriate undedicated general
- 11 revenue to reimburse institutions of higher education for the
- 12 payment of debt service on tuition revenue bonds authorized under
- 13 this subchapter in any state fiscal year in a total amount that
- 14 exceeds 1.25 percent of an amount equal to the average of the amount
- 15 of general revenue fund revenues, excluding revenues
- 16 constitutionally dedicated for purposes other than payment of state
- 17 debt, for each of the three preceding state fiscal years.
- 18 <u>(c) The limit provided by this section applies to</u>
- 19 appropriations made to reimburse debt service on all tuition
- 20 <u>revenue bonds</u>, including previously authorized but unissued bonds.
- 21 (d) The Bond Review Board shall compute the limit provided
- 22 by Subsection (b). The Legislative Budget Board shall provide the
- 23 Bond Review Board with expenditure and appropriations information
- 24 on debt service reimbursements for tuition revenue bonds. The Bond

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- 1 Review Board shall estimate debt service reimbursements for
- 2 previously authorized but unissued bonds using any standard
- 3 assumptions considered appropriate by the Bond Review Board and may
- 4 tailor those assumptions to each institution of higher education
- 5 based on the most recent credit ratings and typical issuing
- 6 practices of that institution.
- 7 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies
- 8 beginning with appropriations for the state fiscal biennium
- 9 beginning September 1, 2013.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
