- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 42, Local Government Code,
- 6 is amended by adding Section 42.0412 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 42.0412. MUNICIPAL INCORPORATION OF CERTAIN
- 8 CENSUS-DESIGNATED PLACES. (a) This section applies only to an
- 9 area:
- 10 (1) that is a census-designated place;
- 11 (2) that has been incorporated and unincorporated as a
- 12 municipality at least twice and has retained the same name;
- 13 (3) that is located in a county with a population of
- 14 800,000 or more that is adjacent to an international border; and
- 15 (4) for which a home-rule municipality has refused to
- 16 give its consent to incorporation under Section 42.041(a).
- 17 (b) The residents of any part of the area described by
- 18 Subsection (a) may initiate an attempt to incorporate as a
- 19 municipality by filing a written petition signed by at least 10
- 20 percent of the registered voters of the area of the proposed
- 21 municipality with the county judge of the county in which the
- 22 proposed municipality is located. The petition must request the
- 23 county judge to order an election to determine whether the area of
- 24 the proposed municipality will incorporate. An incorporation

- 1 election under this section shall be conducted in the same manner as
- 2 the applicable incorporation election under Subtitle A. The
- 3 consent of the municipality that previously refused to give consent
- 4 <u>is not required for the incorporation.</u>
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
