4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle F, Title 8, Insurance Code, is amended
6	by adding Chapter 1459 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 1459. FAIR ACCESS TO TELEPHONE CONSULTATIONS
8	Sec. 1459.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Employee benefit plan" means a plan, fund or
10	program established or maintained by an employer or employee
11	organization.
12	(2) "Health insurance policy" means any individual,
13	group, blanket, or franchise insurance policy, insurance
14	agreement, or group hospital service contract.
15	(3) "Physician" means an individual licensed to
16	practice medicine in this state; a professional association
17	composed solely of individuals licensed to practice medicine in
18	this state; a single legal entity authorized to practice medicine
19	in this state that is owned by two or more individuals licensed to
20	practice medicine in this state; a nonprofit health corporation
21	certified by the Texas Medical Board under Chapter 162, Occupations

Code; and a partnership composed solely of individuals licensed to

practice medicine in this state.

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- 1 SERVICES. (a) An employee benefit plan or health insurance policy
- 2 may not:
- 3 (1) prohibit a physician from charging for a telephone
- 4 consultation with a covered patient if that employee benefit plan
- 5 or health insurance policy allows any other person to charge for
- 6 telephone consultations with covered patients;
- 7 (2) deny payment to a physician for a medically
- 8 necessary telephone consultation with a covered patient if that
- 9 employee benefit plan or health insurance policy pays any other
- 10 person for telephone consultations with covered patients; or
- 11 (3) discriminate against physicians in determining
- 12 payment amounts for medically necessary telephone consultations
- 13 provided to covered patients if that employee benefit plan or
- 14 health insurance policy pays any other person for telephone
- 15 consultations with covered patients.
- 16 (b) Nothing in this Section shall be construed as
- 17 prohibiting an employee benefit plan or health insurance policy
- 18 from paying a physician for medically necessary telephone
- 19 consultations.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
