## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the electronic mail address of a prospective juror.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 62.0111(c), Government Code, is amended
5	to read as follows:
6	(c) The county officer responsible for summoning jurors
7	shall <u>ensure that</u> [ <del>purge</del> ] the electronic mail address of a
8	prospective juror collected under Subsection (b) <u>is kept</u>
9	confidential and is not disclosed to anyone other than the court,
10	court staff, and attorneys and parties to the case on which the
11	<pre>prospective juror would serve [+</pre>
12	[(1) if the prospective juror serves on a jury, not
13	later than the 30th day after the date that:
14	[(A) the county sends the person payment for jury
15	service; or
16	[(B) the county would otherwise send the person
17	payment for jury service, if the person has donated the payment
18	under Section 61.003; or
19	[(2) if the prospective juror does not serve on a jury,
20	not later than the 30th day after the date that the court releases
21	the person from jury service].
