4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 37, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter E-1 to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER E-1. COMPLAINTS FOR CERTAIN MISDEMEANOR OFFENSES
8	Sec. 37.141. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Child" means a person who is:
10	(A) younger than 17 years of age; and
11	(B) not married, divorced, or widowed.
12	(2) "School offense" means an offense, other than a
13	traffic offense, committed by a child on property under the control
14	and jurisdiction of a school district.
15	Sec. 37.142. CONFLICT OF LAW. To the extent of any
16	conflict, this subchapter controls over any other law applied to a
17	school offense alleged to have been committed by a child.
18	Sec. 37.143. CITATION PROHIBITED; CUSTODY OF CHILD. (a)
19	Notwithstanding Article 14.06(b), Code of Criminal Procedure, a
20	peace officer may not issue a citation to a child who is alleged to
21	have committed a school offense.
22	(b) This subchapter does not prohibit a child from being
23	taken into custody under Section 52.01, Family Code, or a peace
24	officer from issuing a citation to a student who is not a child.

- 1 Sec. 37.144. COMPLAINT. A school may file a complaint
- 2 against a child who is alleged to have committed a school offense
- 3 with a criminal court in accordance with Section 37.145.
- 4 Sec. 37.145. REQUISITES OF COMPLAINT. A complaint alleging
- 5 the commission of a school offense must, in addition to the
- 6 requirements imposed by Articles 45.018 and 45.019, Code of
- 7 Criminal Procedure:
- 8 <u>(1) be sworn to by a person who has personal knowledge</u>
- 9 of the underlying facts giving rise to probable cause to believe
- 10 that an offense has been committed; and
- 11 (2) be accompanied by a statement from a school
- 12 employee stating whether the child is eligible for or receives
- 13 special services under Subchapter A, Chapter 29.
- 14 Sec. 37.146. DISMISSAL OF COMPLAINT. A court shall dismiss
- 15 <u>a complaint alleging a school offense that is not filed in</u>
- 16 <u>compliance with this subchapter.</u>
- 17 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 18 an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 19 offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed
- 20 by the law in effect at the time the offense was committed, and the
- 21 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For the
- 22 purposes of this section, an offense is committed before the
- 23 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense was
- 24 committed before that date.
- 25 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
