A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN	ACT
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- 2 relating to the creation of a task force to conduct a study and
- 3 develop recommendations to alleviate the incidence of gun violence
- 4 in this state.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. TEXAS TASK FORCE ON GUN VIOLENCE. (a) The
- 7 Texas Task Force on Gun Violence is created.
- 8 (b) The task force shall study the causes and effects of gun
- 9 violence in this state. After completing the study, the task force
- 10 shall develop recommendations for programs and propose legislation
- 11 to alleviate the incidence of gun violence in this state.
- 12 (c) The task force is composed of the following nine
- 13 members:
- 14 (1) three members appointed by the governor, one of
- 15 whom is a proponent of private gun ownership, one of whom is an
- 16 opponent of private gun ownership, and one of whom is employed in
- 17 the medical profession;
- 18 (2) three members appointed by the lieutenant
- 19 governor, one of whom is a prosecuting attorney, one of whom is a
- 20 university scholar with expertise on the issue of gun violence, and
- 21 one of whom is a community advocate; and
- 22 (3) three members appointed by the speaker of the
- 23 house of representatives, one of whom is a state representative,
- 24 one of whom is a state senator, and one of whom is appropriately

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- 1 qualified as determined by the speaker.
- 2 (d) The governor shall designate a member of the task force
- 3 to serve as presiding officer.
- 4 (e) A member of the task force is not entitled to
- 5 compensation but is entitled to reimbursement for the member's
- 6 travel expenses as provided by Chapter 660, Government Code, and
- 7 the General Appropriations Act.
- 8 (f) The Texas Legislative Council and the Legislative
- 9 Budget Board shall assist the task force in performing its duties.
- 10 (g) The task force shall compile a detailed report of its
- 11 findings and recommendations, including proposed legislation to
- 12 alleviate the incidence of gun violence in this state, and shall
- 13 submit the report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the
- 14 speaker of the house of representatives not later than December 1,
- 15 2014.
- 16 (h) The task force is not subject to Chapter 2110,
- 17 Government Code.
- 18 (i) The task force is abolished and this Act expires on
- 19 January 1, 2015.
- 20 SECTION 2. APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS. The governor, the
- 21 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
- 22 representatives shall appoint members to the Texas Task Force on
- 23 Gun Violence, as required by this Act, as soon as practicable after
- 24 the effective date of this Act.
- 25 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 26 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 27 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas

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- 1 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 2 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
