- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- SECTION 1. Section 7.111, Education Code, is amended by 5
- amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (a-1) to 6
- read as follows: 7

- (a) The board shall provide for the administration of high 8
- 9 school equivalency examinations [, including administration by the
- adjutant general's department for students described by 10
- Subdivision (2)(C)]. 11
- 12 (a-1) A person who does not have a high school diploma may
- take the examination in accordance with rules adopted by the board 13
- 14 if the person is:
- (1) over 17 years of age; 15
- 16 years of age or older and: 16
- (A) is enrolled in a Job Corps training program 17
- under the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 (29 U.S.C. Section 2801 18
- et seq.), and its subsequent amendments; 19
- is in the custody of a public agency 20 (B)
- 21 [providing supervision of the person or having custody of the
- person] under a court order [recommends that the person take the 22
- 23 examination]; or
- (C) 24 is enrolled in the adjutant general's

- 1 department's Seaborne ChalleNGe Corps; or
- 2 (3) required to take the examination under a [justice
- 3 or municipal] court order [issued under Article 45.054(a)(1)(C),
- 4 Code of Criminal Procedure].
- 5 (c) The board by rule shall develop and deliver high school
- 6 equivalency examinations and provide for the administration of the
- 7 examinations online. The rules must $[\div]$
- 8 $\left[\frac{(1)}{(1)}\right]$ provide a procedure for verifying the identity
- 9 of the person taking the examination [; and
- 10 [(2) prohibit a person under 18 years of age from
- 11 taking the examination online].
- 12 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2013-2014
- 13 school year.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
