- 12 member who directly supports instruction or research at a general
- 13 <u>academic teaching institution.</u>
- 14 (2) "General academic teaching institution" has the
- 15 meaning assigned by Section 61.003.
- 16 (b) Each general academic teaching institution shall
- 17 conduct a study to evaluate the feasibility of reducing by 10
- 18 percent the portion of the institution's annual operating budget
- 19 <u>allocated for administrative staff.</u>
- 20 <u>(c) Not later than September 1, 2014, each general academic</u>
- 21 teaching institution shall complete the study required by
- 22 Subsection (b) and submit to the governor, the lieutenant governor,

- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
