6	SECTION 1. Subchapter I, Chapter 545, Transportation Code,
7	is amended by adding Section 545.428 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 545.428. DRIVING WITH CERTAIN UNTREATED SLEEP
9	DISORDERS; OFFENSE. (a) A person commits an offense if the person:
10	(1) has been diagnosed with sleep apnea or another
11	sleep disorder by a physician but is not receiving medical
12	treatment for the diagnosed disorder; and
13	(2) operates a motor vehicle and by reason of the
14	person's diagnosed disorder causes injury to another person by
15	accident or mistake.
16	(b) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor,
17	except that if it is shown on the trial of an offense under this
18	section that as a result of the commission of the offense a
19	collision occurred causing death, the offense is a state jail

- 1 SECTION 3. Subchapter F, Chapter 522, Transportation Code,
- 2 is amended by adding Section 522.065 to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 522.065. NOTIFICATION OF DIAGNOSIS OF CERTAIN SLEEP
- 4 DISORDERS. (a) A person who applies for employment as a commercial
- 5 motor vehicle driver shall provide the employer, at the time of the
- 6 application, with any history of sleep apnea or other sleep
- 7 disorder that has been diagnosed by a physician, and any medical
- 8 treatment the applicant is receiving for that disorder.
- 9 (b) The applicant must certify that the information
- 10 furnished is true and complete. An employer may require an

- 12 <u>(c) If at any time during employment as a commercial motor</u>

- SECTION 4. Sections 522.072(a) and (b-1), Transportation

- 19 (a) An employer may not knowingly permit a person to drive a

- 2 license, except during the 10-day period beginning on the date the

- 4 (5) the person has been diagnosed with sleep apnea or
- 5 another sleep disorder and is not receiving medical treatment for
- 6 that disorder.
- 7 (b-1) An employer who violates Subsection (a) or (b) commits
- 8 an offense. An offense under this subsection is a Class B
- 9 misdemeanor, except that an offense under Subsection (a)(5) is a
- 10 Class A misdemeanor.
- 11 SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 12 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 13 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 14 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 15 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 16 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 17 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 18 before that date.
- 19 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
