4	SECTION 1. Sections 51.762(a) and (b), Education Code, are
5	amended to read as follows:
6	(a) The board, with the assistance of an advisory committee
7	composed of representatives of general academic teaching
8	institutions, junior college districts, public state colleges, and
9	public technical institutes, and with the consultation of all
10	institutions of higher education that admit freshman-level
11	students:
12	(1) shall adopt by rule:
13	(A) a common admission application form for use
14	by a person seeking admission as a freshman student to a general
15	academic teaching institution; [and]
16	(B) an electronic common admission application
17	form for use by a person seeking admission as a freshman student to
18	an institution of higher education that admits freshman-level
19	students, other than a general academic teaching institution; and
20	(C) if the board determines that adoption of the
21	form would be cost-effective for nursing schools, an electronic
22	common admission application form for use by a person seeking
23	admission as a student to an undergraduate nursing education
24	program at an institution of higher education; and

1 (2) may adopt by rule a printed format common 2 admission application form for use by a person seeking admission as 3 a freshman student to an institution of higher education that 4 admits freshman-level students, other than a general academic 5 teaching institution.

6 (b) The board, with the assistance of an advisory committee 7 representatives of general academic composed of teaching 8 institutions, junior college districts, public state colleges, and public technical institutes, and with the consultation of all 9 10 institutions of higher education that admit undergraduate transfer students, may adopt by rule: 11

(1) a common admission application form for use by a
person seeking admission as an undergraduate transfer student to a
general academic teaching institution; [and]

15 (2) an electronic or printed format common admission 16 application form for use by a person seeking admission as an 17 undergraduate transfer student to an institution of higher 18 education that admits undergraduate transfer students, other than a 19 general academic teaching institution; and

20 <u>(3) if the board determines that adoption of the form</u> 21 would be cost-effective for nursing schools, an electronic common 22 admission application form for use by a person seeking admission as 23 a transfer student to an undergraduate nursing education program at 24 an institution of higher education.

25 SECTION 2. Section 61.026, Education Code, is amended to 26 read as follows:

Sec. 61.026. COMMITTEES AND ADVISORY COMMITTEES. <u>(a)</u> The

chairman may appoint committees from the board's membership as <u>the</u>
 <u>chairman</u> [he] or the board may find necessary from time to time.
 The board may appoint advisory committees from outside its
 membership as it may deem necessary.

5 (b) If the board directs an advisory committee to assist the 6 board in exercising its authority under Section 61.051(j) regarding 7 an off-campus course in nursing education, including clinical 8 coursework, the board shall require the advisory committee to 9 include or consult with one or more private postsecondary 10 educational institutions or private career schools and colleges in 11 this state that offer degree programs.

SECTION 3. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding Subchapter II to read as follows:

14 SUBCHAPTER II. NURSING FACULTY LOAN REPAYMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Sec. 61.9821. REPAYMENT AUTHORIZED. The board shall establish and administer a program to provide, in accordance with this subchapter and board rules, assistance in the repayment of student loans for nurses who:

19 <u>(1) are serving on the faculties of nursing degree</u> 20 programs at institutions of higher education or private or 21 independent institutions of higher education in positions that 22 require an advanced degree in professional nursing; and

(2) apply and qualify for the assistance.

24 <u>Sec. 61.9822.</u> ELIGIBILITY. To be eligible to receive loan 25 repayment assistance under this subchapter, a nurse must:

26 (1) apply to the board;

27 (2) at the time of application for repayment

LIMITATIONS. (a) On qualifying for loan 8 repayment assistance under this subchapter, a nurse may receive repayment assistance for each year of full-time employment as a 9 10 faculty member of a nursing degree program at an institution of higher education or private or independent institution of higher 11 12 education, not to exceed five years. (b) The amount of loan repayment assistance received by a 13 14 nurse under this subchapter may not exceed \$7,000 in any one year. 15 (c) The total amount of loan repayment assistance provided under this subchapter may not exceed the total amount of gifts and 16 17 grants accepted by the board for the repayment assistance and other funds available to the board for the repayment assistance, 18 19 including any money reallocated under Section 61.9826. Sec. 61.9824. ELIGIBLE LOANS. (a) The board may provide 20 repayment assistance for the repayment of any student loan for 21 22 education at any public or private institution of higher education, including a loan for undergraduate education, received by an 23 24 eligible person through any lender. (b) The board may not provide repayment assistance for a 25 26 student loan that is in default at the time of the nurse's 27 application.

2	repayment under this subchapter in a lump sum:
3	(1) payable to both the lender or other holder of the

7	(b) A repayment under this subchapter may be applied to any
8	amount due in connection with the loan.
9	Sec. 61.9826. REALLOCATION OF MONEY. (a) In each state
10	fiscal year, the board shall reallocate for loan repayment
11	assistance under this subchapter for a particular year any money in
12	the physician education loan repayment program account established
13	under Section 61.5391 that exceeds the amount necessary in that
14	fiscal year for purposes of repayment assistance under Subchapter
15	<u>J.</u>
16	(b) Any money reallocated under Subsection (a) in a fiscal
17	year that is not used for loan repayment assistance under this
18	subchapter in that fiscal year is treated as if that unused amount
19	had not been reallocated in that fiscal year.
20	Sec. 61.9827. GIFTS AND GRANTS. The board may solicit and
21	accept gifts and grants from any source for the purposes of this
22	subchapter.
23	Sec. 61.9828. RULES. (a) The board shall adopt rules as
24	necessary to administer this subchapter.
25	(b) The board shall distribute a copy of the rules adopted
26	under this section and pertinent information regarding this
27	subchapter to:

Section 61.5391(b), Education Code, is amended 6 to read as follows: 7 (b) Money in the account may not be appropriated for any 8 purpose except: 9 (1) to provide loan repayment assistance to eligible physicians under this subchapter; or 10 (2) to provide loan repayment assistance under 11 Subchapter II if reallocated under Section 61.9826. 12 SECTION 5. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board 13 shall adopt the rules for loan repayment assistance under 14 Subchapter II, Chapter 61, Education Code, as added by this Act, not 15 later than December 1, 2013. 16 SECTION 6. Not later than September 1, 2014, the Texas 17 Higher Education Coordinating Board shall make an initial 18 determination regarding whether adopting electronic 19 common admission application forms for undergraduate nursing education 20 programs would be cost-effective as required by Sections 51.762(a) 21 and (b), Education Code, as amended by this Act. 22 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013. 23
