A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to a three-year high school diploma plan and cost-neutral
- 3 expansion of full-day prekindergarten programs.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 28.0255 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 28.0255. THREE-YEAR HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA PLAN. (a) A
- 8 school district may develop and implement a program for students
- 9 who wish to obtain a high school diploma after completion of three
- 10 years of secondary school attendance as an alternative to the
- 11 traditional four-year period of attendance.
- 12 (b) Participation by a student in the program must be
- 13 voluntary, with approval of the student's parent. A student who
- 14 agrees to participate in the program may, on request, discontinue
- 15 participation and resume taking courses under the minimum,
- 16 recommended, or advanced high school program.
- 17 <u>(c) Notwithstanding Section 28.025, the school district</u>
- 18 shall specify the curriculum requirements for receiving a high
- 19 school diploma under the program. The curriculum requirements must
- 20 ensure that a student who graduates under the program possesses
- 21 <u>sufficient knowledge and skills in English language arts and</u>
- 22 mathematics to be capable of performing successfully in
- 23 postsecondary education courses.
- 24 (d) The school district shall submit the proposed

- 1 curriculum requirements to the State Board of Education for comment
- 2 and the commissioner for approval. The district may not implement
- 3 the program before obtaining the commissioner's approval of the
- 4 proposed curriculum requirements.
- 5 (e) A student is entitled to a high school diploma if the
- 6 student:
- 7 (1) successfully complies with the curriculum
- 8 requirements specified under Subsection (c); and
- 9 (2) performs satisfactorily, as determined by the
- 10 commissioner under Subsection (f), on end-of-course assessment
- 11 instruments listed under Section 39.023(c) for courses in which the
- 12 student was enrolled.
- (f) For purposes of Subsection (e)(2), the commissioner
- 14 shall determine the level of satisfactory performance on applicable
- 15 <u>end-of-course assessment instruments administered to a student.</u>
- 16 <u>(g) The school district shall report the academic</u>
- 17 achievement record of students who have completed the program on a
- 18 transcript that clearly identifies the program and distinguishes
- 19 the program from the minimum, recommended, and advanced high school
- 20 programs.
- 21 (h) A student who has received a diploma under the program
- 22 <u>is exempt from the compulsory school attendance requirements under</u>
- 23 <u>Section 25.085.</u>
- 24 (i) To the extent this section conflicts with any other
- 25 provision of this code or rule adopted under this code, this section
- 26 prevails.
- 27 SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 42, Education Code, is

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- 1 amended by adding Section 42.2526 to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 42.2526. ADJUSTMENT FOR DISTRICT OPERATING THREE-YEAR
- 3 DIPLOMA PROGRAM. (a) This section applies only to a school
- 4 district operating a program authorized by Section 28.0255.
- 5 (b) Beginning with the first school year that follows the
- 6 first school year in which students receive high school diplomas
- 7 under the program authorized by Section 28.0255 and continuing for
- 8 every subsequent school year that the district operates the
- 9 program, the commissioner shall provide funding for the district's
- 10 prekindergarten program under Section 29.153 on a full-day basis
- 11 for a number of prekindergarten students equal to twice the number
- 12 of students who received a high school diploma under the program
- 13 authorized by Section 28.0255 during the preceding school year.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
