1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of a permit to allow alcoholic beverage
3	wholesalers to store alcoholic beverages at certain auxiliary
4	locations; providing for a permitting fee.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 3, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 19A to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 19A. WHOLESALER'S BRANCH PERMIT
9	Sec. 19A.01. AUTHORIZED ACTIVITIES. The holder of a
10	wholesaler's branch permit may maintain one or more auxiliary
11	locations other than the permitted premises maintained by the
12	permit holder under the authority of a wholesaler's permit to store
13	alcoholic beverages that are in transit between premises covered by

- 14 that wholesaler's permit and the premises of a retailer, including
- 15 the holder of a private club registration permit, or another
- 16 wholesaler.
- Sec. 19A.02. FEE. The commission shall exercise the
- 18 commission's authority under Section 5.50(b) to set an annual state
- 19 <u>fee for a wholesaler's branch permit.</u>
- Sec. 19A.03. ELIGIBILITY FOR PERMIT. A wholesaler's branch
- 21 permit may only be issued to the holder of a wholesaler's permit.
- Sec. 19A.04. MINIMUM STORAGE PERIOD. Alcoholic beverages
- 23 delivered to an auxiliary location permitted under this chapter
- 24 must remain in storage at that location for at least 24 hours before

- 1 being transported to another location.
- 2 Sec. 19A.05. ORIGINATION OF SALES OR SHIPPING PROHIBITED.
- 3 The holder of a wholesaler's branch permit may not:
- 4 (1) sell or take orders for alcoholic beverages at an
- 5 auxiliary location permitted under this chapter; or
- 6 (2) initiate shipping from an auxiliary location
- 7 permitted under this chapter of an alcoholic beverage sold by the
- 8 permit holder under the authority of the permit holder's
- 9 wholesaler's permit.
- 10 Sec. 19A.06. SAMPLING OF BEVERAGES AUTHORIZED. The holder
- 11 of a wholesaler's branch permit may allow retailers to sample
- 12 alcoholic beverages at no charge at a location permitted under this
- 13 <u>chapter.</u>
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
