4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 1551.004(a), Insurance Code, is amended
6	to read as follows:
7	(a) In this chapter, "dependent" with respect to ar
8	individual eligible to participate in the group benefits program
9	means the individual's:
10	(1) spouse;
11	(2) unmarried child younger than 26 years of age;
12	(3) child of any age who the board of trustees
13	determines lives with or has the child's care provided by the
14	individual on a regular basis if[+
15	$[\frac{A}{A}]$ the child is mentally or physically
16	incapacitated to the extent that the child is dependent on the
17	individual for care or support, as determined by the board of
18	trustees;
19	(B) the child's coverage under this chapter has
20	not lapsed; and
21	(C) the child is at least 26 years old and:
22	[(i) was enrolled as a participant in the
23	health benefits coverage under the group benefits program on the

[(ii) on the date the individual became eligible to participate in the group benefits program, was enrolled as the individual's dependent in health benefits coverage under Chapter 1575, 1579, or 1601 or in continuation of that dependent coverage under the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985 (Pub. L. No. 99-272) and its subsequent amendments;

- 7 (4) child of any age who is unmarried, for purposes of 8 health benefit coverage under this chapter, on expiration of the 9 child's continuation coverage under the Consolidated Omnibus 10 Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985 (Pub. L. No. 99-272) and its 11 subsequent amendments; and
- 12 (5) ward, as that term is defined by Section 601, Texas
 13 Probate Code, who is 26 years of age or younger.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
