- (b-1) The period of ineligibility begins on the date on 9
- which a trial court enters a judgment finding the provider liable 10
- under Section 36.052 [the determination that the provider is liable 11
- 12 becomes final].
- 13 (b-3) Notwithstanding Subsection (b-1), the period of
- 14 ineligibility for a physician, a physician organization, or an
- individual licensed by a health care regulatory agency begins on 15
- 16 the date on which the determination that the physician, physician
- organization, or individual is liable becomes final and all appeals 17
- relating to that determination are exhausted or waived. 18
- (f) For purposes of Subsection (b-3): 19
