- 2 relating to the regulation of political contributions and
- 3 expenditures.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 251.001, Election Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subdivision (21) to read as follows:
- 7 (21) "In-kind contribution" means a contribution of
- 8 goods, services, or any other thing of value, except money.
- 9 SECTION 2. Sections 252.0011(c) and (d), Election Code, are
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (c) Subsection (a) does not apply to a person if, in any
- 12 quarterly [semiannual] reporting period prescribed by Chapter 254:
- 13 (1) the political committee in connection with which
- 14 the person's ineligibility arose did not accept political
- 15 contributions that in the aggregate exceed \$2,500 [\$5,000] or make
- 16 political expenditures that in the aggregate exceed \$2,500
- $17 \left[\frac{\$5,000}{} \right]$; and
- 18 (2) the candidate who or political committee that
- 19 subsequently appoints the person does not accept political
- 20 contributions that in the aggregate exceed \$2,500 [\$5,000] or make
- 21 political expenditures that in the aggregate exceed \$2,500
- 22 [\$5,000].
- 23 (d) Subsection (c) applies to a person who is the campaign
- 24 treasurer of a general-purpose committee regardless of whether the

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- 1 committee files monthly reports under Section 254.155. For
- 2 purposes of this subsection, political contributions accepted and
- 3 political expenditures made during a monthly reporting period are
- 4 aggregated with political contributions accepted and political
- 5 expenditures made in each other monthly reporting period that
- 6 corresponds to the <u>quarterly</u> [semiannual] reporting period that
- 7 contains those months.
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 254.031, Election Code, is amended by
- 9 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to read as
- 10 follows:
- 11 (a) Except as otherwise provided by this chapter, each
- 12 report filed under this chapter must include:
- 13 (1) the amount of political contributions from each
- 14 person that in the aggregate exceed \$50 and that are accepted during
- 15 the reporting period by the person or committee required to file a
- 16 report under this chapter, the full name and address of the person
- 17 making the contributions, and the dates of the contributions;
- 18 (2) the amount of loans that are made during the
- 19 reporting period for campaign or officeholder purposes to the
- 20 person or committee required to file the report and that in the
- 21 aggregate exceed \$50, the dates the loans are made, the interest
- 22 rate, the maturity date, the type of collateral for the loans, if
- 23 any, the full name and address of the person or financial
- 24 institution making the loans, the full name and address, principal
- 25 occupation, and name of the employer of each guarantor of the loans,
- 26 the amount of the loans guaranteed by each guarantor, and the
- 27 aggregate principal amount of all outstanding loans as of the last

- 1 day of the reporting period;
- 2 (3) the amount of political expenditures that in the
- 3 aggregate exceed \$100 and that are made during the reporting
- 4 period, the full name and address of the persons to whom the
- 5 expenditures are made, and the dates and purposes of the
- 6 expenditures;
- 7 (4) the amount of each payment made during the
- 8 reporting period from a political contribution if the payment is
- 9 not a political expenditure, the full name and address of the person
- 10 to whom the payment is made, and the date and purpose of the
- 11 payment;
- 12 (5) the total amount or a specific listing of the
- 13 political contributions of \$50 or less accepted and the total
- 14 amount or a specific listing of the political expenditures of \$100
- 15 or less made during the reporting period;
- 16 (6) the total amount of all political contributions
- 17 accepted and the total amount of all political expenditures made
- 18 during the reporting period;
- 19 (7) the name of each candidate or officeholder who
- 20 benefits from a direct campaign expenditure made during the
- 21 reporting period by the person or committee required to file the
- 22 report, and the office sought or held, excluding a direct campaign
- 23 expenditure that is made by the principal political committee of a
- 24 political party on behalf of a slate of two or more nominees of that
- 25 party;
- 26 (8) as of the last day of a reporting period for which
- 27 the person is required to file a report, the difference obtained

- 1 from subtracting any payment for a political expenditure made
- 2 through a negotiable instrument, credit card, or similar method
- 3 that has not yet been processed from the total amount of political
- 4 contributions accepted and deposited, including interest or other
- 5 income on those contributions, maintained in one or more accounts
- 6 in which political contributions are deposited as of the last day of
- 7 the reporting period;
- 8 (9) any credit, interest, rebate, refund,
- 9 reimbursement, or return of a deposit fee resulting from the use of
- 10 a political contribution or an asset purchased with a political
- 11 contribution that is received during the reporting period and the
- 12 amount of which exceeds \$100;
- 13 (10) any proceeds of the sale of an asset purchased
- 14 with a political contribution that is received during the reporting
- 15 period and the amount of which exceeds \$100;
- 16 (11) any investment purchased with a political
- 17 contribution that is received during the reporting period and the
- 18 amount of which exceeds \$100;
- 19 (12) any other gain from a political contribution that
- 20 is received during the reporting period and the amount of which
- 21 exceeds \$100; [and]
- 22 (13) the full name and address of each person from whom
- 23 an amount described by Subdivision (9), (10), (11), or (12) is
- 24 received, the date the amount is received, and the purpose for which
- 25 the amount is received;
- 26 (14) the amount of in-kind political contributions
- 27 from each person that in the aggregate exceed \$50 and that are used

- 1 or expended during the reporting period and the date and purpose of
- 2 such use or expenditure; and
- 3 (15) the amount of each bill or invoice that has been
- 4 assessed but for which payment has not yet been made.
- 5 (c) For purposes of Subsections (a)(3) and (4), the date of
- 6 an expenditure or payment made with a credit card is the date of the
- 7 purchase.
- 8 SECTION 4. Section 254.0401(a), Election Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 (a) The commission shall make each report filed with the
- 11 commission under Section 254.036(b) available to the public on the
- 12 Internet as soon as practicable after [not later than the second
- 13 business day after the date] the report is filed.
- 14 SECTION 5. Section 254.0405, Election Code, is amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- Sec. 254.0405. AMENDMENT OF FILED REPORT. (a) A person
- 17 who files a quarterly or semiannual report under this chapter may
- 18 amend the report.
- 19 (b) A quarterly or semiannual report that is amended before
- 20 the eighth day after the date the original report was filed is
- 21 considered to have been filed on the date on which the original
- 22 report was filed.
- 23 (c) A <u>quarterly or</u> semiannual report that is amended on or
- 24 after the eighth day after the original report was filed is
- 25 considered to have been filed on the date on which the original
- 26 report was filed if:
- 27 (1) the amendment is made before any complaint is

- 1 filed with regard to the subject of the amendment; and
- 2 (2) the original report was made in good faith and
- 3 without an intent to mislead or to misrepresent the information
- 4 contained in the report.
- 5 SECTION 6. Section 254.041(d), Election Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (d) It is an exception to the application of Subsection
- 8 (a)(3) that:
- 9 (1) the information was required to be included in a
- 10 quarterly or semiannual report; and
- 11 (2) the person amended the report within the time
- 12 prescribed by Section 254.0405(b) or under the circumstances
- 13 described by Section 254.0405(c).
- 14 SECTION 7. Section 254.063, Election Code, is amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 254.063. QUARTERLY [SEMIANNUAL] REPORTING SCHEDULE
- 17 FOR CANDIDATE. (a) A candidate shall file four [two] reports for
- 18 each year as provided by this section.
- 19 (b) The first report shall be filed not later than April
- 20 [July] 15. The report covers the period beginning January 1, the
- 21 day the candidate's campaign treasurer appointment is filed, or the
- 22 first day after the period covered by the last report required to be
- 23 filed under this subchapter, as applicable, and continuing through
- 24 March 31 [June 30].
- 25 (c) The second report shall be filed not later than July
- 26 [January] 15. The report covers the period beginning April [July]
- 27 1, the day the candidate's campaign treasurer appointment is filed,

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- 1 or the first day after the period covered by the last report
- 2 required to be filed under this subchapter, as applicable, and
- 3 continuing through June 30 [December 31].
- 4 (d) The third report shall be filed not later than October
- 5 15. The report covers the period beginning July 1, the day the
- 6 candidate's campaign treasurer appointment is filed, or the first
- 7 day after the period covered by the last report required to be filed
- 8 under this subchapter, as applicable, and continuing through
- 9 September 30.
- 10 (e) The fourth report shall be filed not later than January
- 11 15. The report covers the period beginning October 1, the day the
- 12 <u>candidate's campaign treasurer appointment is filed, or the first</u>
- 13 day after the period covered by the last report required to be filed
- 14 under this subchapter, as applicable, and continuing through
- 15 <u>December 31.</u>
- SECTION 8. Section 254.123, Election Code, is amended to
- 17 read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 254.123. QUARTERLY [SEMIANNUAL] REPORTING SCHEDULE
- 19 FOR COMMITTEE. (a) The campaign treasurer of a specific-purpose
- 20 committee shall file <u>four</u> [two] reports for each year as provided by
- 21 this section.
- (b) The first report shall be filed not later than April
- 23 [July] 15. The report covers the period beginning January 1, the
- 24 day the committee's campaign treasurer appointment is filed, or the
- 25 first day after the period covered by the last report required to be
- 26 filed under this subchapter, as applicable, and continuing through
- 27 March 31 [June 30].

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- 1 (c) The second report shall be filed not later than <u>July</u>
- 2 [January] 15. The report covers the period beginning April [July]
- 3 1, the day the committee's campaign treasurer appointment is filed,
- 4 or the first day after the period covered by the last report
- 5 required to be filed under this subchapter, as applicable, and
- 6 continuing through <u>June 30</u> [December 31].
- 7 (d) The third report shall be filed not later than October
- 8 15. The report covers the period beginning July 1, the day the
- 9 committee's campaign treasurer appointment is filed, or the first
- 10 day after the period covered by the last report required to be filed
- 11 under this subchapter, as applicable, and continuing through
- 12 September 30.
- 13 (e) The fourth report shall be filed not later than January
- 14 15. The report covers the period beginning October 1, the day the
- 15 committee's campaign treasurer appointment is filed, or the first
- 16 day after the period covered by the last report required to be filed
- 17 under this subchapter, as applicable, and continuing through
- 18 December 31.
- 19 SECTION 9. Section 254.153, Election Code, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- 21 Sec. 254.153. QUARTERLY [SEMIANNUAL] REPORTING SCHEDULE
- 22 FOR COMMITTEE. (a) The campaign treasurer of a general-purpose
- 23 committee shall file <u>four</u> [two] reports for each year as provided by
- 24 this section.
- 25 (b) The first report shall be filed not later than April
- 26 [July] 15. The report covers the period beginning January 1, the
- 27 day the committee's campaign treasurer appointment is filed, or the

- 1 first day after the period covered by the last report required to be
- 2 filed under this subchapter, as applicable, and continuing through
- 3 March 31 [June 30].
- 4 (c) The second report shall be filed not later than July
- 5 [January] 15. The report covers the period beginning April [July]
- 6 1, the day the committee's campaign treasurer appointment is filed,
- 7 or the first day after the period covered by the last report
- 8 required to be filed under this subchapter, as applicable, and
- 9 continuing through June 30 [December 31].
- 10 (d) The third report shall be filed not later than October
- 11 15. The report covers the period beginning July 1, the day the
- 12 <u>committee's campaign treasurer appointment is filed, or the first</u>
- 13 day after the period covered by the last report required to be filed
- 14 under this subchapter, as applicable, and continuing through
- 15 <u>September 30.</u>
- (e) The fourth report shall be filed not later than January
- 17 15. The report covers the period beginning October 1, the day the
- 18 committee's campaign treasurer appointment is filed, or the first
- 19 day after the period covered by the last report required to be filed
- 20 under this subchapter, as applicable, and continuing through
- 21 December 31.
- SECTION 10. Section 254.184(b), Election Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- 24 (b) A candidate or committee filing under this subchapter is
- 25 not required to file any reports of political contributions and
- 26 political expenditures other than the $\underline{quarterly}$ [$\underline{semiannual}$]
- 27 reports required to be filed not later than April 15, July 15,

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- 1 October 15, and January 15.
- 2 SECTION 11. Sections 254.0401(b) and (f), Election Code,
- 3 are repealed.
- 4 SECTION 12. This Act takes effect January 1, 2014.
