A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the operation of a motor vehicle in the vicinity of an
- 3 unprotected road user; providing penalties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter I, Chapter 545, Transportation Code,
- 6 is amended by adding Section 545.428 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 545.428. UNPROTECTED ROAD USERS. (a) In this section,
- 8 "unprotected road user" means:
- 9 <u>(1) a pedestrian, including a runner, physically</u>
- 10 <u>disabled person</u>, highway construction and maintenance worker, tow
- 11 truck operator, utility worker, other worker operating legally in
- 12 or near the road or right-of-way, or stranded motorist or
- 13 passenger;
- 14 (2) a person on horseback;
- 15 (3) a person operating equipment other than a motor
- 16 vehicle, including a bicycle, handcycle, horse-driven conveyance,
- 17 or unprotected farm equipment; or
- 18 (4) a person operating a motorcycle, moped,
- 19 motor-driven cycle, or motor-assisted scooter.
- (b) An operator of a motor vehicle passing an unprotected
- 21 road user operating on a highway or street shall:
- 22 (1) vacate the lane in which the unprotected road user
- 23 is located if the highway has two or more marked lanes running in
- 24 the same direction; or

- 1 (2) pass the unprotected road user at a safe distance.
- 2 (c) For the purposes of Subsection (b)(2), when road
- 3 conditions allow, safe distance is at least:
- 4 (1) three feet if the operator's vehicle is a passenger
- 5 car or light truck; or
- 6 (2) six feet if the operator's vehicle is a truck,
- 7 other than a light truck, that is a commercial motor vehicle as
- 8 defined by Section 522.003.
- 9 (d) An operator of a motor vehicle that is making a turn at
- 10 an intersection, including an intersection with an alley or private
- 11 road or driveway, shall yield the right-of-way to an unprotected
- 12 road user who is in the intersection or in such proximity to the
- 13 intersection as to be an immediate hazard.
- 14 (e) An operator of a motor vehicle may not overtake an
- 15 unprotected road user and subsequently turn in front of the
- 16 unprotected road user unless the operator is safely clear of the
- 17 unprotected road user, taking into account the speed at which the
- 18 unprotected road user is traveling and the braking requirements of
- 19 the turning vehicle.
- 20 (f) An operator of a motor vehicle may not maneuver the
- 21 <u>vehicle in a manner that:</u>
- 22 (1) is intended to cause intimidation or harassment to
- 23 an unprotected road user; or
- 24 (2) threatens an unprotected road user.
- 25 (g) An operator of a motor vehicle shall exercise due care
- 26 to avoid colliding with any unprotected road user on a roadway or in
- 27 <u>an intersection</u> of roadways.

- 1 (h) A violation of this section is punishable under Section
- 2 542.401 except that:
- 3 (1) if the violation results in property damage, the
- 4 violation is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500;
- 5 <u>or</u>
- 6 (2) if the violation results in bodily injury, the
- 7 violation is a Class B misdemeanor.
- 8 <u>(i) It is a defense to prosecution under this section that</u>
- 9 at the time of the offense the unprotected road user was acting in
- 10 violation of the law.
- 11 (j) If conduct constituting an offense under this section
- 12 also constitutes an offense under another section of this code or
- 13 the Penal Code, the actor may be prosecuted under either section or
- 14 both sections.
- 15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
