Section 2 6399), who qualifies as homeless under Subdivision (1), (2), or 3 4 (3). Sec. 2306.1102. STUDY ON HOMELESS YOUTH. (a) 5 The department, in conjunction with the Department of Family and 6 Protective Services, the Texas Education Agency, and the Texas 7 Homeless Education Office, shall conduct a study on homeless youth. 8 (b) In conducting the study, the department shall: 9 (1) collect data on the number of homeless youth in 10 11 this state; 12 (2) examine the needs of homeless youth and the degree to which current programs are meeting those needs; and 13 (3) identify any sources of funding that might be 14 15 available to provide services to homeless youth. 16 (c) The department shall submit a report on the study to the 17 legislature not later than December 1, 2014. The report must include a summary of the information resulting from the study and 18 recommendations for changes in law necessary to provide services to 19 or otherwise assist homeless youth. 20 21 (d) This section expires September 1, 2015. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2.2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 23 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
