- 2 relating to the regulation of propane utility companies.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 101.002(b), Utilities Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (b) Gas utilities, including propane utilities, are by
- 7 definition monopolies in the areas they serve. As a result, the
- 8 normal forces of competition that regulate prices in a free
- 9 enterprise society do not operate. Public agencies regulate
- 10 utility rates, operations, and services as a substitute for
- 11 competition.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 101.003, Utilities Code, is amended by
- 13 amending Subdivision (7) and adding Subdivision (11-a) to read as
- 14 follows:
- 15 (7) "Gas utility" includes a person or river authority
- 16 that owns or operates for compensation in this state equipment or
- 17 facilities to transmit or distribute combustible hydrocarbon
- 18 natural gas or synthetic natural gas for sale or resale in a manner
- 19 not subject to the jurisdiction of the Federal Energy Regulatory
- 20 Commission under the Natural Gas Act (15 U.S.C. Section 717 et
- 21 seq.). The term includes a lessee, trustee, or receiver of a gas
- 22 utility. The term includes a propane utility. The term does not
- 23 include:
- 24 (A) a municipal corporation;

- 2 person or river authority:
- 3 (i) produces, gathers, transports, or sells
- 4 natural gas or synthetic natural gas under Section 121.004 or
- 5 121.005;
- 6 (ii) distributes or sells liquefied
- 7 petroleum gas; or
- 8 (iii) transports, delivers, or sells
- 9 natural gas for fuel for irrigation wells or any other direct
- 10 agricultural use;
- 11 (C) a person to the extent the person:
- 12 (i) sells natural gas for use as vehicle
- 13 fuel;
- 14 (ii) sells natural gas to a person who later
- 15 sells the natural gas for use as vehicle fuel; or
- 16 (iii) owns or operates equipment or
- 17 facilities to sell or transport natural gas for ultimate use as
- 18 vehicle fuel;
- 19 (D) a person not otherwise a gas utility who
- 20 furnishes gas or gas service only to itself, its employees, or its
- 21 tenants as an incident of employment or tenancy, if the gas or gas
- 22 service is not resold to or used by others;
- 23 (E) a person excluded from being considered a gas
- 24 utility under Section 121.007; or
- 25 (F) an electric cooperative, as that term is
- 26 defined by Section 11.003, or its subsidiary, that is excluded from
- 27 regulation as a gas utility by Section 121.008.

- 1 (11-a) "Propane utility" means a person that is
- 2 registered with the railroad commission's liquefied petroleum gas
- 3 division and that owns or operates for compensation in this state
- 4 equipment or facilities to transmit, store, or distribute liquefied
- 5 petroleum gas to a residential neighborhood. The term includes a
- 6 lessee, trustee, or receiver of a propane utility. The term does
- 7 <u>not include a person not otherwise a propane utility who furnishes</u>
- 8 propane gas service only to itself, its employees, or its tenants as
- 9 an incident of employment or tenancy, if the propane gas service is
- 10 not resold or used by others.
- SECTION 3. Section 102.001(a), Utilities Code, is amended
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 (a) The railroad commission has exclusive original
- 14 jurisdiction over the rates and services of a gas utility:
- 15 (1) that distributes natural gas, propane gas, or
- 16 synthetic natural gas in:
- 17 (A) areas outside a municipality; and
- 18 (B) areas inside a municipality that surrenders
- 19 its jurisdiction to the railroad commission under Section 103.003;
- 20 and
- 21 (2) that transmits, transports, delivers, or sells
- 22 natural gas, propane gas, or synthetic natural gas to a gas utility
- 23 that distributes the gas to the public.
- SECTION 4. Section 104.2545, Utilities Code, is amended by
- 25 adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 26 (e) This section does not apply to a propane utility.
- 27 SECTION 5. Section 104.258, Utilities Code, is amended to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 104.258. DISCONNECTION OF NATURAL GAS OR PROPANE GAS
- 3 SERVICE. (a) In this section:
- 4 (1) "Extreme weather emergency" means a period during
- 5 which the previous day's highest temperature did not exceed 32
- 6 degrees Fahrenheit and the temperature is predicted to remain at or
- 7 below that level for the next 24 hours according to the nearest
- 8 National Weather Service reports.
- 9 (2) "Provider" means:
- 10 (A) a gas utility, as defined by Sections 101.003
- 11 and 121.001; [and]
- 12 (A-1) a propane utility, as defined by Section
- 13 101.003; and
- 14 (B) an owner, operator, or manager of a mobile
- 15 home park or apartment who purchases natural gas or propane gas
- 16 through a master meter for delivery to a dwelling unit in a mobile
- 17 home park or apartment house under Chapter 124.
- 18 (b) A provider may not disconnect natural gas or propane gas
- 19 service to a residential customer on a weekend day unless personnel
- 20 of the provider are available on that day to take payments and
- 21 reconnect service.
- (c) A provider may not disconnect natural gas or propane gas
- 23 service to a residential customer during an extreme weather
- 24 emergency. The provider shall defer collection of the full payment
- 25 of bills that are due during an extreme weather emergency until
- 26 after the emergency is over and shall work with customers to
- 27 establish a pay schedule for deferred bills.
