A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to a state animal identification program and the
- 3 identification of animals vaccinated for or infected with
- 4 brucellosis.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Sections 161.056(a) and (c), Agriculture Code,
- 7 are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) In order to provide for disease control and enhance the
- 9 ability to trace disease-infected animals or animals that have been
- 10 exposed to disease, the commission may develop and implement a
- 11 <u>state</u> [an] animal identification program <u>for a species</u> that is <u>no</u>
- 12 more stringent than the federal animal disease traceability or
- 13 <u>animal identification program for that species</u> [consistent with the
- 14 United States Department of Agriculture's National Animal
- 15 <u>Identification System</u>].
- 16 (c) The commission may require the use of official
- 17 identification numbers assigned as part of the state animal
- 18 identification program [for animal disease control, animal
- 19 emergency management, and other commission programs].
- 20 SECTION 2. Section 163.064(c), Agriculture Code, is amended
- 21 to read as follows:
- (c) The commission may by rule regulate and require the
- 23 vaccination of female cattle within all or any of the area
- 24 classifications. Among other rules, the commission may adopt rules

- 1 providing for:
- 2 (1) the identification of cattle to be vaccinated
- 3 consistent with Section 161.056;
- 4 (2) approval of the vaccine used; and
- 5 (3) the method of administering the vaccine.
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 163.065(a), Agriculture Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (a) If a tested animal shows evidence of infection with
- 9 brucellosis, the person performing the test shall handle the animal
- 10 in accordance with the rules of the commission. The commission may
- 11 prescribe requirements according to the classification of the area
- 12 in which the animal is located. Among other requirements, the
- 13 commission may require the person performing the test to:
- 14 (1) furnish the owner of the animal with written data
- 15 showing that the animal is infected;
- 16 (2) fire brand the animal on the left jaw with the
- 17 letter "B"; and
- 18 (3) place an approved, numbered identification on the
- 19 animal consistent with Section 161.056[; and
- 20 [(4) report the identification number in writing to
- 21 the commission].
- 22 SECTION 4. Sections 161.056(b), (d), (g), and (h),
- 23 Agriculture Code, are repealed.
- SECTION 5. (a) The repeal by this Act of Section
- 25 161.056(g), Agriculture Code, does not apply to an offense
- 26 committed under that subsection before the effective date of this
- 27 Act. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before

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- 1 the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs
- 2 before that date.
- 3 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 4 Act is governed by Section 161.056(g), Agriculture Code, as it
- 5 existed when the offense was committed, and the former law is
- 6 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 7 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
