A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the extension of an emergency order for protective
- 3 services for certain persons who are elderly or have disabilities.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 48.208(e-2), Human Resources Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (e-2) The court, after notice and a hearing, may extend an
- 8 emergency order issued under this section for a period of not more
- 9 than 30 days after the date the original emergency order for
- 10 protective services would otherwise expire under Subsection (e)
- 11 [was rendered]. The court, after notice and a hearing and for good
- 12 cause shown, may grant a second extension of an emergency order of
- 13 not more than an additional 30 days. The court may not grant more
- 14 than two extensions of the original emergency order. An extension
- 15 order that ends on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday is
- 16 automatically extended to 4 p.m. on the first succeeding business
- 17 day. The court may modify or terminate the emergency order on
- 18 petition of the department, the incapacitated person, or any person
- 19 interested in the person's welfare.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
