- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the Intrastate
- 6 Commerce Act.
- 7 SECTION 2. The Legislature of the State of Texas finds that:
- 8 (1) the Tenth Amendment to the United States
- 9 Constitution reserves to the states and the people all powers not
- 10 granted to the federal government elsewhere in the constitution;
- 11 (2) the Ninth Amendment to the United States
- 12 Constitution guarantees to the people rights not enumerated in the
- 13 constitution and reserves to the people of Texas those rights;
- 14 (3) the federal government is empowered to regulate
- 15 interstate commerce under Section 8, Article I, United States
- 16 Constitution;
- 17 (4) the regulation of intrastate commerce is vested in
- 18 the states under the Ninth and Tenth Amendments to the United States
- 19 Constitution;
- 20 (5) the drafters of the United States Constitution
- 21 specifically considered and rejected a proposal to authorize
- 22 Congress to regulate intrastate commerce that had indirect effects
- 23 on another state; and
- 24 (6) all goods grown, manufactured, made, or otherwise

- 1 produced in this state that remain in this state and all services
- 2 performed exclusively in this state are not subject to the
- 3 authority of the United States Congress under Congress's power to
- 4 regulate interstate commerce.
- 5 SECTION 3. Title 99, Business & Commerce Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Chapter 2005 to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 2005. INTRASTATE GOODS AND SERVICES
- 8 Sec. 2005.001. NOT SUBJECT TO FEDERAL REGULATION. A good
- 9 that is grown, manufactured, made, or otherwise produced in this
- 10 state and remains in this state or a service performed exclusively
- 11 in this state is not subject to federal law or federal regulation
- 12 under the authority of the United States Congress to regulate
- 13 interstate commerce.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act applies only to a good that is grown,
- 15 manufactured, made, or otherwise produced or a service performed on
- 16 or after the effective date of this Act.
- 17 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
