A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the form, content, and provision of payoff statements for property tax loans. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 32.06, Tax Code, is amended by amending Subsection (a-4) and adding Subsection (a-5) to read as follows: 6 (a-4) The Finance Commission of Texas shall: 7 (1) prescribe the form and content of an appropriate 8 9 disclosure statement to be provided to a property owner before the execution of a tax lien transfer; 10 11 (2) adopt rules relating to the reasonableness of 12 closing costs, fees, and other charges permitted under this section; [and] 13 14 (3) by rule prescribe the form and content of the sworn document under Subsection (a-1) and the certified statement under 15 16 Subsection (b); and (4) by rule prescribe the form and content of a request 17 a consensual lender with an existing lien on the property must use 18 19 to request a payoff statement and the transferee's response to the request, including the period within which the transferee must 20 respond. 21 22 (a-5) Notwithstanding Subsection (f-3), a consensual lender 23 described by Subsection (a-4)(4) may request a payoff statement before the tax loan becomes delinquent. The Finance Commission of 24

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Texas by rule shall require a transferee who receives a request for 1 a payoff statement to deliver the requested payoff statement on the 2 prescribed form within a period prescribed by finance commission 3 rule. The prescribed period must allow the transferee at least 4 seven business days after the date the request is received to 5 6 deliver the payoff statement. The consumer credit commissioner may assess an administrative penalty under Subchapter F, Chapter 14, 7 Finance Code, against a transferee who wilfully fails to provide 8 the payoff statement as prescribed by finance commission rule. 9

10 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date 11 of this Act, the Finance Commission of Texas shall adopt rules 12 necessary to implement the changes in law made by this Act.

13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
