3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
5	Subchapter I-1 to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER I-1. Study of Grant Aid and Participation and Success in
7	Higher Education.
8	Sec. 61.511. Study of Grant Aid and Participation and Success
9	in Higher Education. (a) The board shall design and implement a
10	series of randomized controlled trials with educational
11	institutions and analyze the results to determine the causal
12	relationship between the receipt of grant aid and student
13	participation, persistence and graduation. The core purposes in
14	these studies will be to determine the influence of grant aid in:
15	(1) the enrollment decisions of students from Texas public
16	high schools;
17	(2) the extent to which student responses to grant aid
18	change as students progress through the higher education pipeline;
19	and
20	(3) the extent to which student responses to grant aid
21	differ
22	(b) The board shall utilize the results of the randomized
23	controlled trials to:
24	(1) validate quasi-experimental methods that address the

No. 2468 same research questions using the data normally collected by the 1 Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board for accountability 2 3 purposes; 4 (2) identify any additional required data elements to be 5 regularly collected by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board in order to support the valid application 6 of 7 quasi-experimental methodology; and (3) develop a user-friendly tool based upon the validated 8 quasi-experimental methods that can be used to estimate the 9 likelihood of student participation, persistence, and graduation 10 as a function of financial aid. 11 12 (c) A student who participates in the study established by this section is not subject to sections 56.307 (f), (i)(1) and (j) 13 14 of the Education Code. 15 (d) Notwithstanding any other section of the Education Code, the maximum grant award for a student who participates in the 16 17 study established by this section is the amount determined by the coordinating board as the average statewide amount of tuition, 18 19 required fees, and cost of instructional materials that a resident student enrolled full-time in a baccalaureate degree 20 21 SECTION 2. Section 56.304, Education Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a) read as follows: 22 23 To be eligible initially for a TEXAS grant, a person who (a) 24 graduated from high school before May 1, 2013, must: 25 (1) be a resident of this state as determined by 26 coordinating board rules; 27 (2) [either] of the following academic meet one

(ii) satisfaction of the Texas Success instrument designated by the coordinating board under Section 51.3062(c) [or (c)] or qualification for an exemption as described by Section 51.3062(p), (q), or (q-1);

(iii) graduation in the top one-third of the person's high school graduating class or graduation from high school with a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a four-point scale or the equivalent; or

(iv) completion for high school credit of at least one advanced mathematics course following the successful completion of an Algebra II course, as permitted by Section 28.025(b-3), or at least one advanced career and technical course, as permitted by Section 28.025(b-2);

(B) have received an associate degree from a
public or private institution of higher education; or

No. 2468 1 (C) be an undergraduate student who has: 2 (i) previously attended another 3 institution of higher education; 4 (ii) completed at least 24 semester credit 5 hours at any institution or institutions of higher education; and (iii) earned an overall grade point average 6 7 of at least 2.5 on a four-point scale or the equivalent on all 8 course work previously attempted or (D) if sufficient money is available, meet the eligibility 9 10 coordinating board; (4) be enrolled 11 in an undergraduate degree or 12 certificate program at the general academic teaching institution; except as provided under rules adopted under 13 (5) 14 Section 56.304(h)be enrolled as: 15 (A) an entering undergraduate student for at least three-fourths of a full course load, as determined by the 16 17 coordinating board, not later than the 16th month after the calendar month in which the person graduated from high school; 18 19 (B) an entering undergraduate student who entered military service not later than the first anniversary of 20 the date the person graduated from high school and who enrolled for 21 at least three-fourths of a full course load, as determined by the 2.2 coordinating board, at the general academic teaching institution 23 24 not later than 12 months after being honorably discharged from military service; [or] 25 26 (C) an [a continuing] undergraduate student for 27 at least three-fourths of a full course load, as determined by the

Section 56.305(a), Education Code, is amended to 8 read as follows: 9 After initially qualifying for a TEXAS grant, a person 10 (a) may continue to receive a TEXAS grant during each semester or term 11 12 in which the person is enrolled at an eligible institution only if the person: 13 14 (1)meets financial need requirements as defined by 15 the coordinating board; (2) is enrolled in undergraduate 16 an degree or 17 certificate program at an eligible institution; (3) is enrolled for at least three-fourths of a full 18 19 course load for an undergraduate student, as determined by the coordinating board; 20 21 (4) makes satisfactory academic progress toward an undergraduate degree or certificate; 22 23 (5) if applicable under Section 56.3055, participates 24 in a student engagement program as required by that section; and 25 [(5)] complies with any additional nonacademic (6) 26 requirement adopted by the coordinating board. SECTION 6. Subchapter M, Chapter 56, Education Code, 27 is

20	which the recipient may satisfy the requirements of this section.
21	(d) A student engagement program may be operated through any
22	appropriate means, including:
23	(1) mentoring activity;
24	(2) a small group seminar or other learning community;
25	(e) The coordinating board may adopt rules to administer
26	this section, including a rule to allow a person to receive a TEXAS
27	grant without participating in a student engagement program or

after delaying that participation if the person is able to show 1 2 hardship or other good cause that affects the person's ability to satisfy the requirements of this section. For purposes of this 3 subsection, hardship or other good cause includes a severe illness 4 5 or other debilitating condition, responsibility for the care of a sick, injured, or needy person, or active duty or other service in 6 7 the United States armed forces. (f) In adopting rules under Subsection (e), the 8 coordinating board shall appoint and consult with an advisory 9 committee composed of institutional business officers, financial 10 aid administrators, recognized student engagement experts, 11 12 student engagement program administrators, and undergraduate 13 students. 14 (g) This section does not apply to a person who first 15 receives a TEXAS grant for a semester or term before the 2014 fall 16 semester. 17 (h) Not later than December 31, 2018, each general academic teaching institution shall submit to the coordinating board a 18 19 report that contains the following: (1) the rate of participation of the institution's 20 TEXAS grant recipients in student engagement programs; 21 22 students at the institution with similar characteristics, such as college readiness, income, or racial or ethnic background; and 23 24 (3) the institution's plans for improving persistence, retention, and graduation rates for its TEXAS grant recipients. 25 26 (i) Each general academic teaching institution shall attempt to consolidate the report required by Subsection (h) with 27

<u>its other relevant reports to the coordinating board regarding the</u>
 <u>TEXAS grant program.</u>

3 (j) Subsections (g), (h), and (i) and this subsection expire
4 December 31, 2019.

5 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
