20	SECTION 2. Section 38.013(a), Education Code, is amended to
21	read as follows:
22	(a) The agency shall make available to each school district
23	one or more coordinated health programs designed to prevent
24	obesity, cardiovascular disease, [and] Type 2 diabetes, and mental
25	health concerns in elementary school, middle school, and junior
26	high school students. Each program must provide for coordinating:
27	(1) health education;

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- 1 (2) physical education and physical activity;
- 2 (3) nutrition services; [and]
- 3 (4) parental involvement; and
- 4 (5) physical and mental health policies, services, and
- 5 <u>supports</u>.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
