A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the disclosure of certain information to the secretary
- 3 of state for use in voter registration or the administration of
- 4 elections.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Sections 521.044(a) and (c), Transportation
- 7 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) Information provided on a driver's license application
- 9 that relates to the applicant's social security number may be used
- 10 only by the department or disclosed only to:
- 11 (1) the child support enforcement division of the
- 12 attorney general's office;
- 13 (2) another state entity responsible for enforcing the
- 14 payment of child support;
- 15 (3) the United States Selective Service System as
- 16 provided by Section 521.147; [er]
- 17 (4) the unclaimed property division of the
- 18 comptroller's office; or
- 19 <u>(5)</u> the secretary of state for the purposes of voter
- 20 registration or the administration of elections.
- 21 (c) On the request of a state entity responsible for
- 22 investigating or enforcing the payment of child support or the
- 23 secretary of state, the department shall disclose information
- 24 regarding an applicant's social security number.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 521.059, Transportation Code, is amended
- 2 by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 3 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter,
- 4 the department shall use the image verification system established
- 5 under this section to assist the secretary of state in the
- 6 performance of its official duties regarding voter registration or
- 7 the administration of elections.
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 730.005, Transportation Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 730.005. REQUIRED DISCLOSURE. Personal information
- 11 obtained by an agency in connection with a motor vehicle record
- 12 shall be disclosed for use in connection with any matter of:
- 13 (1) motor vehicle or motor vehicle operator safety;
- 14 (2) motor vehicle theft;
- 15 (3) motor vehicle emissions;
- 16 (4) motor vehicle product alterations, recalls, or
- 17 advisories;
- 18 (5) performance monitoring of motor vehicles or motor
- 19 vehicle dealers by a motor vehicle manufacturer;
- 20 (6) removal of nonowner records from the original
- 21 owner records of a motor vehicle manufacturer to carry out the
- 22 purposes of:
- (A) the Automobile Information Disclosure Act,
- 24 15 U.S.C. Section 1231 et seq.;
- 25 (B) 49 U.S.C. Chapters 301, 305, 323, 325, 327,
- 26 329, and 331;
- (C) the Anti Car Theft Act of 1992, 18 U.S.C.

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- 1 Sections 553, 981, 982, 2119, 2312, 2313, and 2322, 19 U.S.C.
- 2 Sections 1646b and 1646c, and 42 U.S.C. Section 3750a et seq., all
- 3 as amended;
- 4 (D) the Clean Air Act, 42 U.S.C. Section 7401 et
- 5 seq., as amended; and
- 6 (E) any other statute or regulation enacted or
- 7 adopted under or in relation to a law included in Paragraphs
- 8 (A)-(D);
- 9 (7) child support enforcement under Chapter 231,
- 10 Family Code; [or]
- 11 (8) enforcement by the Texas Workforce Commission
- 12 under Title 4, Labor Code; or
- 13 (9) voter registration or the administration of
- 14 elections by the secretary of state.
- SECTION 4. Section 730.007(c), Transportation Code, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 (c) This section does not:
- 18 (1) prohibit the disclosure of a person's photographic
- 19 image to:
- 20 (A) a law enforcement agency or a criminal
- 21 justice agency for an official purpose;
- 22 (B) an agency of this state investigating an
- 23 alleged violation of a state or federal law relating to the
- 24 obtaining, selling, or purchasing of a benefit authorized by
- 25 Chapter 31 or 33, Human Resources Code; [or]
- 26 (C) an agency of this state investigating an
- 27 alleged violation of a state or federal law under authority

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- 1 provided by Title 4, Labor Code; or
- 2 (D) the secretary of state for the purpose of
- 3 voter registration or the administration of elections; or
- 4 (2) prevent a court from compelling by subpoena the
- 5 production of a person's photographic image.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
