Section 54.0411(a), Family Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a) If a disposition hearing is held under Section 54.04 of this code, the juvenile court, after giving the child, parent, or 8 9 other person responsible for the child's support a reasonable opportunity to be heard, shall order the child, parent, or other 10 person, if financially able to do so, to pay a fee as costs of court 11 of <u>\$300</u> [\$20]. 12 SECTION 2. Section 54.061(a), Family Code, is amended to 13 read as follows: (a) If a child is placed on probation under Section 54.04(d)(1) of this code, the juvenile court, after giving the child, parent, or other person responsible for the child's support

16 17 a reasonable opportunity to be heard, shall order the child, 18 parent, or other person, if financially able to do so, to pay to the 19 court a fee of not more than $\frac{60}{10}$ [$\frac{15}{10}$] a month during the period that 20 the child continues on probation. 21

SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 19 a fee or court cost imposed in a juvenile case for conduct violating 20 a penal law that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. 21 Conduct violating a penal law occurs on or after the effective date 22 23 of this Act if any element of the violation occurs on or after that 24 date. Conduct that occurs before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the time the conduct occurred, and 25 26 that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

27 SECTION 5. Section 51.607, Government Code, does not apply
