A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to tuition and fee exemptions for certain military
- 3 personnel and their dependents.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 54.341, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (c), (d), and (l) and adding Subsection (o) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (c) A person may not receive exemptions provided for by this
- 9 section for more than a cumulative total of 135 $[\frac{150}{2}]$ credit hours.
- 10 (d) The governing board of each institution of higher
- 11 education granting an exemption under this section shall require
- 12 each applicant claiming the exemption to submit to the institution
- 13 an application for the exemption and satisfactory evidence that the
- 14 applicant qualifies for the exemption not later than the 12th class
- 15 day of the semester or term to which the exemption applies [one year
- 16 after the earlier of the date the institution:
- 17 [(1) provides written notice to the applicant of the
- 18 applicant's eligibility for the exemption; or
- 19 [(2) receives a written acknowledgement from the
- 20 applicant evidencing the applicant's awareness of the applicant's
- 21 eligibility for the exemption].
- 22 (1) To be eligible to receive an exemption under Subsection
- 23 (k), the child must:
- 24 (1) be a student who is classified as a resident under

- 1 Subchapter B when the child enrolls in an institution of higher
- 2 education; and
- 3 (2) <u>meet the</u> [make] satisfactory academic progress
- 4 requirements of this section [in a degree, certificate, or
- 5 continuing education program as determined by the institution at
- 6 which the child is enrolled in accordance with the policy of the
- 7 institution's financial aid department, except that the
- 8 institution may not require the child to enroll in a minimum course
- 9 load].
- 10 (o) To receive an exemption provided by this section, a
- 11 person otherwise eligible for the exemption must make satisfactory
- 12 <u>academic progress toward a degree or certificate at the institution</u>
- 13 by maintaining an overall grade point average of at least 2.5 on a
- 14 4-point scale or the equivalent on all course work attempted by the
- 15 person at the institution.
- 16 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply
- 17 beginning with tuition and fees for the 2013 fall semester. Tuition
- 18 and fees for a term or semester before the 2013 fall semester are
- 19 covered by the law in effect immediately before the effective date
- 20 of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 21 purpose.
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 27 legislative session.
