- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 311, Government Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 311.035 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 311.035. CONSTRUCTION OF STATUTE OR RULE INVOLVING
- 8 CRIMINAL OFFENSE OR PENALTY. (a) In this section, "actor" and
- 9 "element of offense" have the meanings assigned by Section 1.07,

- 11 (b) A statute or rule that creates or defines a criminal
- 12 offense or penalty shall be strictly construed against the
- 13 government and construed in favor of the actor if any part of the
- 14 statute or rule is susceptible to more than one objectively
- 15 reasonable interpretation, including:

criminal offenses and penalties.

- 16 (1) an element of offense; or
- 17 (2) the penalty to be imposed.
- SECTION 2. Sections 1.05(a) and (b), Penal Code, are
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 (a) The rule that a penal statute is to be strictly
- 21 construed applies [does not apply] to this code. [The provisions of
- 22 this code shall be construed according to the fair import of their
- 23 terms, to promote justice and effect the objectives of the code.

- 5 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies to a
- 6 criminal proceeding that commences on or after the effective date
- 7 of this Act. A criminal proceeding that commences before the
- 8 effective date of this Act is covered by the law in effect when the
- 9 proceeding commenced, and the former law is continued in effect for
- 10 that purpose.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
