3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 32, Health and Safety Code, is amended by
5	adding Subchapter C to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER C. TASK FORCE ON DOMESTIC VIOLENCE
7	Sec. 32.061. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "task force"
8	means the task force on domestic violence.
9	Sec. 32.062. ESTABLISHMENT; PRESIDING OFFICER. (a) The
10	task force is composed of 25 members appointed by the executive
11	commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission as
12	follows:
13	(1) four representatives of family violence centers,
14	as defined by Section 51.002, Human Resources Code, from different
15	geographic regions in this state, including both rural and urban
16	areas;
17	(2) one representative of a statewide family violence
18	advocacy organization;
19	(3) one representative of a statewide association of
20	obstetricians and gynecologists;
21	(4) two representatives of the family and community
22	health programs in the Department of State Health Services;
23	(5) one representative of a statewide sexual assault
24	advocacy organization;

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1	(6) one representative of the Health and Human
2	Services Commission Texas Home Visiting Program;
3	(7) one representative of a statewide association of
4	midwifery;
5	(8) one representative of a statewide family
6	physician's association;
7	(9) one representative of a statewide nursing
8	association;
9	(10) one representative of a statewide hospital
10	association;
11	(11) one representative of a statewide pediatric
12	medical association;
13	(12) one representative of a statewide medical
14	association;
15	(13) one representative of The University of Texas
16	School of Social Work Institute on Domestic Violence and Sexual
17	Assault;
18	(14) one representative of The University of Texas
19	School of Law Domestic Violence Clinic;
20	(15) one representative of the governor's EMS and
21	Trauma Advisory Council;
22	(16) one representative of a Department of Family and
23	Protective Services prevention and early intervention program;
24	(17) one representative of a statewide osteopathic
25	medical association;
26	(18) one representative of a statewide association of
27	<pre>community health centers;</pre>

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1	(19) one representative of the office of the attorney
2	general;
3	(20) one representative from a medical school or a
4	teaching hospital in the state who is either an attending physician
5	of the hospital or a faculty member of the medical school; and
6	(21) one representative of the Health and Human
7	Services Commission's Family Violence Program.
8	(b) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human
9	Services Commission shall appoint a task force member to serve as
10	presiding officer of the task force.
11	Sec. 32.063. DUTIES OF TASK FORCE. The task force shall
12	meet at the call of the presiding officer to:
13	(1) examine the impact of domestic violence on
14	maternal and infant mortality, the health of mothers, and the
15	health and development of fetuses, infants, and children;
16	(2) identify the health care services available to
17	children age two and younger and mothers and explore opportunities
18	for improving the ability of those services to address domestic
19	violence;
20	(3) identify methods to effectively include domestic
21	violence information and support in educational standards for
22	educators and protocols for health care providers; and
23	(4) investigate and make recommendations relating to
24	the coordination of health care services for children age two and
25	younger and pregnant and postpartum women who are victims of
26	domestic violence, including recommendations for improving early
27	screening and detection and public awareness efforts.

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Sec. 32.064. REPORT. Not later than September 1, 2015, the 1 2 task force shall submit a report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, the 3 presiding officers of the standing committees of the legislature 4 having primary jurisdiction over health and human services, the 5 6 executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission, and the commissioner of state health services containing: 7 8 (1) the findings and legislative, policy, and research 9 recommendations of the task force; and (2) a description of the activities of the task force. 10 Sec. 32.065. EXPIRATION. The task force is abolished and 11 12 this subchapter expires January 1, 2016.

13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
