3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 32, Health and Safety Code, is amended by
5	adding Subchapter C to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER C. TASK FORCE ON DOMESTIC VIOLENCE
7	Sec. 32.061. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "task force"
8	means the task force on domestic violence.
9	Sec. 32.062. ESTABLISHMENT; PRESIDING OFFICER. (a) The
10	task force is composed of 25 members appointed by the executive
11	commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission as

- 13 <u>(1) four representatives of family violence centers,</u>
- 14 as defined by Section 51.002, Human Resources Code, from different
- 15 geographic regions in this state, including both rural and urban
- 16 areas;

follows:

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- 17 (2) one representative of a statewide family violence
- 18 <u>advocacy organization;</u>
- 19 (3) one representative of a statewide association of
- 20 <u>obstetricians and gynecologists;</u>
- 21 (4) two representatives of the family and community
- 22 health programs in the Department of State Health Services;
- 23 (5) one representative of a statewide sexual assault
- 24 advocacy organization;

(6) one representative of the Health and Human 1 2 Services Commission Texas Home Visiting Program; 3 (7) one representative of a statewide association of 4 midwifery; 5 (8) one representative of a statewide family physician's association; 6 7 (9) one representative of a statewide nursing 8 association; 9 (10) one representative of a statewide hospital 10 association; (11) one representative of a statewide pediatric 11 12 medical association; (12) one representative of a statewide medical 13 14 association; 15 (13) one representative of The University of Texas School of Social Work Institute on Domestic Violence and Sexual 16 17 Assault; (14) one representative of The University of Texas 18 19 School of Law Domestic Violence Clinic; 20 (15) one representative of the governor's EMS and Trauma Advisory Council; 21 22 (16) one representative of a Department of Family and Protective Services prevention and early intervention program; 23 24 (17) one representative of a statewide osteopathic 25 medical association; 26 (18) one representative of a statewide association of

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community health centers;

- 1 (19) one representative of the Family Initiatives
- 2 section of the child support division of the office of the attorney
- 3 general;
- 4 (20) one representative from a medical school or a
- 5 teaching hospital in the state who is either an attending physician
- 6 of the hospital or a faculty member of the medical school; and
- 7 (21) one representative of the Health and Human
- 8 Services Commission's Family Violence Program.
- 9 (b) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 10 Services Commission shall appoint a task force member to serve as
- 11 presiding officer of the task force.
- 12 Sec. 32.063. DUTIES OF TASK FORCE. The task force shall
- 13 meet at the call of the presiding officer to:
- 14 (1) examine the impact of domestic violence on
- 15 maternal and infant mortality, the health of mothers, and the
- 16 health and development of fetuses, infants, and children;
- 17 (2) identify the health care services available to
- 18 children age two and younger and mothers and explore opportunities
- 19 for improving the ability of those services to address domestic
- 20 violence;
- 21 (3) identify methods to effectively include domestic
- 22 <u>violence information and support in educational standards for</u>
- 23 educators and protocols for health care providers; and
- 24 (4) investigate and make recommendations relating to
- 25 the coordination of health care services for children age two and
- 26 younger and pregnant and postpartum women who are victims of
- 27 domestic violence, including recommendations for improving early

- 1 screening and detection and public awareness efforts.
- Sec. 32.064. REPORT. Not later than September 1, 2015, the
- 3 task force shall submit a report to the governor, the lieutenant
- 4 governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, the
- 5 presiding officers of the standing committees of the legislature
- 6 having primary jurisdiction over health and human services, the
- 7 executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission,
- 8 and the commissioner of state health services containing:
- 9 (1) the findings and legislative, policy, and research
- 10 recommendations of the task force; and
- 11 (2) a description of the activities of the task force.
- 12 Sec. 32.065. EXPIRATION. The task force is abolished and
- 13 this subchapter expires January 1, 2016.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
