2	relating to complaints filed with the Texas Optometry Board.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Title 3, Subtitle F, Chapter 351, Occupations
5	Code, is amended by adding Section 351.206 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 351.206 REMEDIAL PLAN. (a) The board may issue and
7	establish the terms of a remedial plan to resolve the investigation
8	of a complaint relating to this chapter.
9	(b) A remedial plan may not contain a provision that:
10	(1) revokes, suspends, limits, or restricts a person's
11	license or other authorization to practice optometry or therapeutic
12	optometry; or
13	(2) assesses an administrative penalty against a
14	person.
15	(c) A remedial plan may not be imposed to resolve a
16	<pre>complaint:</pre>
17	(1) concerning:
18	(A) a death;
19	(B) a hospitalization; or
20	(C) the commission of a felony; or
21	(2) in which the appropriate resolution may involve a
22	restriction on the manner in which a license holder practices
23	optometry or therapeutic optometry.
24	(d) The board may not issue a remedial plan to resolve a

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- 1 complaint against a license holder if the license holder has
- 2 entered into a remedial plan with the board in the preceding 24
- 3 months for the resolution of a different complaint relating to this
- 4 <u>subtitle</u>.
- 5 (e) If a license holder complies with and successfully
- 6 completes the terms of a remedial plan, the board shall remove all
- 7 records of the remedial plan from the board's records on the second
- 8 anniversary of the date the license holder successfully completes
- 9 the remedial plan.
- 10 (f) The board may assess a fee against a license holder
- 11 participating in a remedial plan in an amount necessary to recover
- 12 the costs of administering the plan.
- 13 <u>(g) The board shall adopt rules necessary to implement this</u>
- 14 section.
- SECTION 2. Section 351.206, Occupations Code, as added by
- 16 this Act, applies only to a complaint filed on or after the
- 17 effective date of this Act. A complaint filed before that date is
- 18 governed by the law in effect on the date the complaint was filed,
- 19 and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
