A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2	relating to a personal financial literacy credit for high school
3	programs.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 28.002(a), Education Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	(a) Each school district that offers kindergarten through
8	grade 12 shall offer, as a required curriculum:
9	(1) a foundation curriculum that includes:
10	(A) English language arts;
11	(B) mathematics;
12	(C) science; and
13	(D) social studies, consisting of Texas, United
14	States, and world history, government, economics, with emphasis on
15	the free enterprise system and its benefits, and geography; and
16	(2) an enrichment curriculum that includes:
17	(A) to the extent possible, languages other than
18	English;
19	(B) health, with emphasis on the importance of
20	proper nutrition and exercise;
21	(C) physical education;
22	(D) fine arts;
23	(E) career and technology education;
24	(F) technology applications; [and]

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- 1 (G) religious literature, including the Hebrew
- 2 Scriptures (Old Testament) and New Testament, and its impact on
- 3 history and literature; and
- 4 (H) personal financial literacy.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 28.0021(a), Education Code, as amended
- 6 by Chapters 214 (H.B. 34) and 885 (S.B. 290), Acts of the 82nd
- 7 Legislature, Regular Session, 2011, is reenacted and amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (a) The Texas essential knowledge and skills and, as
- 10 applicable, Section 28.025 shall <u>include</u> [require] instruction in
- 11 personal financial literacy, including instruction in methods of
- 12 paying for college and other postsecondary education and training,
- 13 in:
- 14 (1) mathematics instruction in kindergarten through
- 15 grade eight; and
- 16 (2) one or more courses <u>offered</u> [required] for high
- 17 school graduation.
- SECTION 3. Sections 28.0021(b) and (c), Education Code, are
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 (b) Each school district and each open-enrollment charter
- 21 school that offers a high school program shall provide an elective
- 22 course [to a student instruction] in personal financial literacy
- 23 <u>that meets</u> [in any course meeting] the requirements for a one-half
- 24 elective [an economics] credit under Section 28.025, using
- 25 materials approved by the State Board of Education. The
- 26 instruction in personal financial literacy must include
- 27 instruction on completing the application for federal student aid

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1 provided by the United States Department of Education. In fulfilling the requirement to provide financial 2 3 instruction under this section, а school open-enrollment charter school may use an existing state, federal, 4 private, or nonprofit program that provides students without charge 5 the instruction described under this section. [Each district and 6 each open-enrollment charter school that offers a high school 7 8 program shall ensure that a district or charter school student enrolled at an institution of higher education in a dual credit 9 10 course meeting the requirements for an economics credit under Section 28.025 receives the instruction described under this 11 12 subsection.

The State Board of Education shall, not later than 13 14 January 31, 2012, identify the essential knowledge and skills of 15 personal financial literacy instruction to include instruction in methods of paying for college and other postsecondary education and 16 17 training and shall, not later than August 31, 2012, approve under (b) materials that 18 Subsection provide for 19 instruction. Beginning with the 2013-2014 school year, each school district and each open-enrollment charter school that offers 20 a high school program shall include, in the elective course 21 [required instruction] in personal financial literacy, instruction 22 23 in methods of paying for college and other postsecondary education 24 and training and use materials approved for that purpose under Subsection (b) [and shall ensure that the instruction described 25 26 under this subsection is provided to a district or charter school student enrolled at an institution of higher education in a dual 27

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- 1 credit course meeting the requirements for an economics
- 2 credit]. This subsection expires September 1, 2014.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
