A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the protection and care of individuals with

- 3 intellectual and developmental disabilities.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 411.1144, Government
- 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 411.1144. ACCESS TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD
- 8 INFORMATION: AGENCIES WITH EMPLOYEES, CONTRACTORS, OR VOLUNTEERS
- 9 AT STATE SUPPORTED LIVING CENTERS.
- SECTION 2. Sections 411.1144(a) and (d), Government Code,
- 11 are amended to read as follows:
- 12 (a) The Department of State Health Services, [and] the
- 13 Department of Aging and Disability Services, and the Health and
- 14 Human Services Commission are entitled to obtain from the
- 15 department criminal history record information maintained by the
- 16 department that relates to a person:
- 17 (1) who is:
- 18 (A) an applicant for employment with the agency;
- 19 (B) an employee of the agency;
- 20 (C) a volunteer with the agency; [or]
- 21 (D) an applicant for a volunteer position with
- 22 the agency;
- (E) an applicant for a contract with the agency;
- 24 or

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- 1 (F) a contractor of the agency; and
- 2 (2) who would be placed in direct contact with a
- 3 resident or client, as defined by Section 555.001, Health and
- 4 Safety Code [of a state supported living center or the ICF-MR
- 5 component of the Rio Grande State Center].
- 6 (d) Subject to Section 411.087, the Department of State
- 7 Health Services, [and] the Department of Aging and Disability
- 8 Services, and the Health and Human Services Commission are entitled
- 9 to:
- 10 (1) obtain through the Federal Bureau of Investigation
- 11 criminal history record information maintained or indexed by that
- 12 bureau that pertains to a person described by Subsection (a); and
- 13 (2) obtain from any other criminal justice agency in
- 14 this state criminal history record information maintained by that
- 15 criminal justice agency that relates to a person described by
- 16 Subsection (a).
- 17 SECTION 3. The heading to Subchapter U, Chapter 531,
- 18 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 19 SUBCHAPTER U. MORTALITY REVIEW FOR CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS WITH
- 20 INTELLECTUAL OR DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES
- SECTION 4. Subchapter U, Chapter 531, Government Code, is
- 22 amended by adding Section 531.8501 to read as follows:
- Sec. 531.8501. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "contracted
- 24 organization" means an entity that contracts with the Health and
- 25 Human Services Commission for the provision of services as
- 26 described by Section 531.851(c).
- 27 SECTION 5. Sections 531.851(a), (c), (d), and (e),

- 1 Government Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a) The executive commissioner shall establish an
- 3 independent mortality review system to review the death of a person
- 4 with an intellectual or [a] developmental disability who, at the
- 5 time of the person's death or at any time during the 24-hour period
- 6 before the person's death:
- 7 (1) resided in or received services from:
- 8 (A) an intermediate care facility for persons
- 9 with an intellectual or developmental disability (ICF/IID) [mental
- 10 retardation (ICF-MR) operated or licensed by the Department of
- 11 Aging and Disability Services or a community center; or
- 12 (B) the ICF/IID [ICF-MR] component of the Rio
- 13 Grande State Center; or
- 14 (2) received services [residential assistance]
- 15 through a Section 1915(c) waiver program <u>for</u> [serving] individuals
- 16 who are eligible for $\underline{ICF/IID}$ [$\underline{ICF-MR}$] services [$\underline{in \ a \ residence \ in}$
- 17 which residential assistance is provided to three or more persons
- 18 and in which the waiver program provider has a property interest].
- 19 (c) The executive commissioner shall contract with an
- 20 institution of higher education or a health care organization or
- 21 association with experience in conducting research-based mortality
- 22 studies [a patient safety organization certified in accordance with
- 23 42 C.F.R. Part 3, as effective on January 19, 2009, occupant
- 24 independent mortality reviews of persons with an intellectual or
- 25 developmental disability [required by this subchapter]. The
- 26 contract must require the contracted [patient safety] organization
- 27 to form a [conduct an independent mortality] review [using a] team

- 1 consisting of:
- 2 (1) a physician with expertise regarding the medical
- 3 treatment of individuals with intellectual or developmental
- 4 disabilities [mental retardation];
- 5 (2) a registered nurse with expertise regarding the
- 6 medical treatment of individuals with intellectual or
- 7 developmental disabilities [mental retardation];
- 8 (3) a clinician or other professional with expertise
- 9 in the delivery of services and supports for individuals with
- 10 <u>intellectual or developmental disabilities</u> [mental retardation];
- 11 and
- 12 (4) any other appropriate person as provided by the
- 13 executive commissioner.
- 14 (d) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules regarding
- 15 the manner in which the death of a person described by Subsection
- 16 (a) must be reported to the <u>contracted</u> [patient safety]
- 17 organization by a facility or waiver program provider described by
- 18 that subsection.
- 19 (e) To ensure consistency across mortality review systems,
- 20 a review under this section must collect information consistent
- 21 with the information required to be collected by any other
- 22 independent mortality review process established specifically for
- 23 persons with intellectual or developmental disabilities [mental
- 24 retardation].
- 25 SECTION 6. Section 531.852, Government Code, is amended to
- 26 read as follows:
- Sec. 531.852. ACCESS TO INFORMATION. (a) A contracted

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- 1 [patient safety] organization may request information and records
- 2 regarding a deceased person as necessary to carry out the
- 3 <u>contracted</u> [patient safety] organization's duties. Records and
- 4 information that may be requested under this section include:
- 5 (1) medical, dental, and mental health care
- 6 information; and
- 7 (2) information and records maintained by any state or
- 8 local government agency, including:
- 9 (A) a birth certificate;
- 10 (B) law enforcement investigative data;
- 11 (C) medical examiner investigative data;
- 12 (D) juvenile court records;
- 13 (E) parole and probation information and
- 14 records; and
- 15 (F) adult or child protective services
- 16 information and records.
- 17 (b) On request of the contracted [patient safety]
- 18 organization, the custodian of the relevant information and records
- 19 relating to a deceased person shall provide those records to the
- 20 <u>contracted</u> [patient safety] organization at no charge.
- 21 SECTION 7. Section 531.853, Government Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- Sec. 531.853. MORTALITY REVIEW REPORT. Subject to Section
- 24 <u>531.854</u>, a contracted [The patient safety] organization shall[, to
- 25 the extent allowed by federal law, submit:
- 26 (1) to the Department of Aging and Disability
- 27 Services, the Department of Family and Protective Services, the

- 1 office of independent ombudsman for state supported living centers,
- 2 and the commission's office of inspector general a report of the
- 3 findings of the mortality review; and
- 4 (2) semiannually to the governor, the lieutenant
- 5 governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, and the
- 6 standing committees of the senate and house of representatives with
- 7 primary jurisdiction over the Department of Aging and Disability
- 8 Services, the Department of Family and Protective Services, the
- 9 office of independent ombudsman for state supported living centers,
- 10 and the commission's office of inspector general a report that
- 11 contains:
- 12 (A) aggregate information regarding the deaths
- 13 for which the contracted [patient safety] organization performed an
- 14 independent mortality review;
- 15 (B) trends in the causes of death identified by
- 16 the contracted [patient safety] organization; and
- 17 (C) any suggestions for system-wide improvements
- 18 to address conditions that contributed to deaths reviewed by the
- 19 contracted [patient safety] organization.
- SECTION 8. Section 531.854, Government Code, is amended by
- 21 amending Subsections (a), (b), and (e) and adding Subsections (f)
- 22 and (g) to read as follows:
- 23 (a) The commission may use or publish information under this
- 24 subchapter only to advance statewide practices regarding the
- 25 treatment and care of individuals with intellectual and
- 26 developmental disabilities. A summary of the data in the
- 27 contracted [patient safety] organization's reports or a

- 1 statistical compilation of data reports may be released by the
- 2 commission for general publication if the summary or statistical
- 3 compilation does not contain any information that would permit the
- 4 identification of an individual or that is confidential or
- 5 privileged under this subchapter or other state or federal law
- 6 [patient safety work product].
- 7 (b) Information and records acquired by the <u>contracted</u>
- 8 [patient safety] organization in the exercise of its duties under
- 9 this subchapter are confidential and exempt from disclosure under
- 10 the open records law, Chapter 552, and may be disclosed only as
- 11 necessary to carry out the contracted [patient safety]
- 12 organization's duties.
- 13 (e) Reports, information, statements, memoranda, and other
- 14 information furnished under this subchapter to the contracted
- 15 <u>organization</u> and any findings or conclusions resulting from a
- 16 review by the <u>contracted</u> [patient safety] organization are
- 17 privileged.
- 18 (f) A contracted organization's report of the findings of
- 19 the independent mortality review conducted under this subchapter
- 20 and any records developed by the contracted organization relating
- 21 to the review:
- 22 (1) are confidential and privileged;
- 23 (2) are not subject to discovery or subpoena; and
- 24 (3) may not be introduced into evidence in any civil,
- 25 criminal, or administrative proceeding.
- 26 (g) A member of the contracted organization's review team
- 27 may not testify or be required to testify in a civil, criminal, or

- 1 administrative proceeding as to observations, factual findings, or
- 2 conclusions that were made in conducting a review under this
- 3 subchapter.
- 4 SECTION 9. Section 531.855, Government Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 531.855. LIMITATION ON LIABILITY. A health care
- 7 provider or other person is not civilly or criminally liable for
- 8 furnishing information to the contracted [patient safety]
- 9 organization or to the commission for use by the contracted
- 10 [patient safety] organization in accordance with this subchapter
- 11 unless the person acted in bad faith or knowingly provided false
- 12 information to the contracted [patient safety] organization or the
- 13 commission.
- 14 SECTION 10. Section 555.021, Health and Safety Code, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 555.021. REQUIRED CRIMINAL HISTORY CHECKS FOR
- 17 EMPLOYEES, CONTRACTORS, AND VOLUNTEERS [OF CENTERS]. (a) The
- 18 department, [and] the Department of State Health Services, and the
- 19 <u>Health and Human Services Commission</u> shall perform a state and
- 20 federal criminal history background check on a person:
- 21 (1) who is:
- (A) an applicant for employment with the agency;
- 23 (B) an employee of the agency;
- 24 (C) a volunteer with the agency; [or]
- (D) an applicant for a volunteer position with
- 26 the agency;
- (E) an applicant for a contract with the agency;

- 1 <u>or</u>
- 2 (F) a contractor of the agency; and
- 3 (2) who would be placed in direct contact with a
- 4 resident or client.
- 5 (b) The department, [and] the Department of State Health
- 6 Services, and the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 7 require a person described by Subsection (a) to submit fingerprints
- 8 in a form and of a quality acceptable to the Department of Public
- 9 Safety and the Federal Bureau of Investigation for use in
- 10 conducting a criminal history background check.
- 11 (c) Each agency shall obtain electronic updates from the
- 12 Department of Public Safety of arrests and convictions of a person:
- 13 (1) for whom the agency performs a background check
- 14 under Subsection (a); and
- 15 (2) who remains an employee, contractor, or volunteer
- 16 of the agency and continues to have direct contact with a resident
- 17 or client.
- 18 SECTION 11. Section 252.134, Health and Safety Code, is
- 19 repealed.
- SECTION 12. Section 531.851, Government Code, as amended by
- 21 this Act, does not apply to a contract entered into by the executive
- 22 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission before
- 23 June 1, 2013. A contract entered into before June 1, 2013, is
- 24 governed by the law in effect on the date the contract was entered
- 25 into, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 26 SECTION 13. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 27 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each

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- 1 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 2 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 3 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
