H.B. No. 2686

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the creation of a regional food economy and food access
- 3 task force.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. REGIONAL FOOD ECONOMY AND FOOD ACCESS TASK
- 6 FORCE. (a) The regional food economy and food access task force is
- 7 created to study and provide recommendations to the legislature on
- 8 developing this state's regional food economy and improving access
- 9 to healthy food for the people in this state.
- 10 (b) The task force consists of nine members appointed as
- 11 follows:
- 12 (1) one member who is a representative of the food
- 13 retail industry with experience in grocery stores, appointed by the
- 14 governor;
- 15 (2) one member who is a representative of the food
- 16 retail industry with experience in convenience stores, appointed by
- 17 the governor;
- 18 (3) one member who is a representative of a community
- 19 development financial institution, appointed by the governor;
- 20 (4) one member who is a large-scale farmer, as defined
- 21 by the United States Department of Agriculture, appointed by the
- 22 lieutenant governor;
- 23 (5) one member who is a small-scale farmer, as defined
- 24 by the United States Department of Agriculture, with experience in

- 1 farmers markets, appointed by the lieutenant governor;
- 2 (6) one member who is a representative of a food bank,
- 3 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives;
- 4 (7) one member who is a representative of a regional
- 5 food advocacy group, appointed by the speaker of the house of
- 6 representatives;
- 7 (8) one representative of the Texas Department of
- 8 Agriculture, appointed by the commissioner of agriculture; and
- 9 (9) one representative of the Texas A&M AgriLife
- 10 Extension Service, appointed by the chancellor of The Texas A&M
- 11 University System.
- 12 (c) The representative of the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension
- 13 Service serves as the presiding officer of the task force.
- 14 (d) A task force member is not entitled to compensation or
- 15 reimbursement of expenses.
- 16 (e) The task force shall:
- 17 (1) examine the following food economy goals:
- 18 (A) creating and retaining family-wage jobs;
- 19 (B) expanding export and local markets for
- 20 regional products;
- 21 (C) developing regional public-private
- 22 partnerships and leveraging existing public-private partnership
- 23 efforts; and
- 24 (D) improving access to healthy food and food
- 25 security, protecting natural resources, and enhancing community
- 26 connections; and
- 27 (2) develop recommendations for legislation and state

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- 1 agency programming that will improve this state's regional food
- 2 economy and improve access to healthy food for the people in this
- 3 state.
- 4 (f) The task force shall meet not later than the 30th day
- 5 after the date the last initial appointment is made. The task force
- 6 shall meet regularly as necessary at the call of the presiding
- 7 officer.
- 8 (g) Not later than September 1, 2014, the task force shall:
- 9 (1) submit to the legislature a report outlining
- 10 legislative recommendations and recommendations for state agency
- 11 programming; and
- 12 (2) provide a presentation on the task force's
- 13 recommendations to the standing committee of each house of the
- 14 legislature with primary jurisdiction over economic development.
- 15 SECTION 2. EXPIRATION. The task force established under
- 16 this Act is abolished and this Act expires September 1, 2015.
- 17 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 18 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 19 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 20 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 21 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
