A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the sale of a motor vehicle by an unlicensed seller.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 728, Transportation Code, is amended by
5	adding Subchapter D to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER D. SALE OF MOTOR VEHICLES BY UNLICENSED SELLERS
7	Sec. 728.031. AUTHORIZED SELLERS; AUTHORIZED SALES
8	LOCATIONS. (a) In this section, "authorized seller" means:
9	(1) the owner of a motor vehicle;
10	(2) the owner's:
11	(A) spouse;
12	(B) parent or stepparent;
13	(C) grandparent or grandchild;
14	(D) child or stepchild;
15	(E) sibling; or
16	(F) guardian; or
17	(3) a decedent's estate.
18	(b) Except as provided by Subsection $(f)(4)$, a person may
19	not sell or offer for sale a motor vehicle unless the person is an
20	authorized seller.
21	(c) Except as provided by Subsection (f), a person may not
22	park a motor vehicle on public or private property with an
23	indication that the vehicle is for sale displayed on the vehicle.
24	(d) Except as provided by Subsection (e), a motor vehicle

- that is parked in violation of Subsection (c) may be removed: 1
- 2 immediately if parked on public property; or
- 3 (2) two hours after notice under Section 728.032 has
- been posted on the vehicle if parked on private property. 4
- 5 (e) A peace officer who requires a vehicle to be removed under this section shall first attempt to contact the person whose 6 7 contact information is displayed on the vehicle. If the peace officer contacts the person, the peace officer must give the person 8 one hour to provide evidence that the person is an authorized seller 9 and remove the vehicle from the location. If the peace officer is 10 unable to contact the person, or the person is unable to present 11 12 evidence that the person is an authorized seller, the peace officer
- shall cause the vehicle and any property on or in the vehicle to be 13
- 14 removed and stored at a vehicle storage facility in accordance with
- 15 Chapter 2308, Occupations Code.
- (f) This section does not apply to: 16
- 17 (1) a single motor vehicle that is legally parked on
- the premises of the authorized seller's residence, or in the 18
- 19 right-of-way immediately adjacent to the authorized seller's
- 20 residence;
- 21 (2) a motor vehicle that is parked on public or private
- property adjacent to a building or location where the authorized 22
- seller traveled in the normal course of business, including a 23
- 24 building or location where the authorized seller is employed;
- 25 (3) a motor vehicle that is parked on private property
- 26 that has a notarized statement from the property owner displayed on
- the windshield or other conspicuous place on the motor vehicle, 27

- 1 with the name, address, and telephone number of the property owner,
- 2 authorizing the vehicle to be sold on the property; or
- 3 (4) a dealer who holds a current general
- 4 distinguishing number issued under Chapter 503 and who is offering
- 5 a motor vehicle for sale at the location for which the general
- 6 <u>distinguishing number is issued.</u>
- 7 Sec. 728.032. NOTICE PROCEDURES. A peace officer may,
- 8 without the consent of the owner of a motor vehicle parked on
- 9 private property in violation of Section 728.031, cause the vehicle
- 10 and any property on or in the vehicle to be removed and stored at a
- 11 vehicle storage facility at the vehicle owner's expense if:
- 12 (1) the peace officer has mailed actual notice to the
- 13 owner of the motor vehicle that the vehicle is in violation of
- 14 Section 728.031 and that the vehicle will be towed and stored at the
- 15 <u>vehicle owner's expense if it is not removed; or</u>
- 16 (2) the peace officer has attached a conspicuous
- 17 notice on the motor vehicle's front windshield or, if the vehicle
- 18 has no front windshield, to a conspicuous part of the vehicle:
- 19 (A) stating that the motor vehicle is parked in
- 20 violation of Section 728.031;
- 21 (B) stating that the motor vehicle will be towed
- 22 and stored at the expense of the owner of the vehicle not before two
- 23 hours after the notice is attached to the vehicle; and
- (C) listing a telephone number that is answered
- 25 24 hours a day to enable the owner or operator of the vehicle to
- 26 locate the vehicle.
- Sec. 728.033. PROCEDURES FOR TOWING. All towing conducted

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- 1 under this subchapter must be performed in accordance with Chapter
- 2 <u>2308</u>, Occupations Code.
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
