- 6 (b) Under Subsection (a), a district may not amend the

- 12 SECTION 3. Section 36.113, Water Code, as amended by this
- 13 Act, and Section 36.1145, Water Code, as added by this Act, apply
- 14 only to an application to renew or amend a permit submitted to a
- 15 groundwater conservation district on or after the effective date of
- 16 this Act. An application to renew or amend a permit submitted to a
- 17 district before that date is governed by the law in effect on the
- 18 date the application was submitted, and the former law is continued
- 19 in effect for that purpose.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
