- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- SECTION 1. Section 25.094, Education Code, is amended by 5
- amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as 6
- follows: 7

- An individual commits an offense if the individual: 8
- 9 (1)is 12 years of age or older and younger than 18 10 years of age;
- 11 is required to attend school under Section 25.085;
- 12 and
- 13 (3) is absent from [fails to attend] school for the
- 14 amount of time specified under Subsection (a-1) [on 10 or more days
- or parts of days within a six-month period in the same school year 15
- 16 or on three or more days or parts of days within a four-week
- period]. 17
- 18 (a-1) For purposes of Subsection (a), a student may not be
- absent from school: 19
- (1) except as provided by Subdivision (2), on five or 20
- 21 more days or parts of days within a semester; or
- 22 (2) if the student attends a school operating on a
- 23 year-round system under Section 25.084, on 10 or more days or parts
- of days within a six-month period in the same school year, or on 24

- 1 three or more days or parts of days within a four-week period.
- 2 SECTION 2. Sections 25.095(a) and (b), Education Code, are
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 (a) A school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 5 shall notify a student's parent in writing at the beginning of the
- 6 school year that if the student is absent from school on five or
- 7 more days or parts of days within a semester, or if the student
- 8 attends a school operating on a year-round system under Section
- 9 25.084, on 10 or more days or parts of days within a six-month
- 10 period in the same school year or on three or more days or parts of
- 11 days within a four-week period:
- 12 (1) the student's parent is subject to prosecution
- 13 under Section 25.093; and
- 14 (2) the student is subject to prosecution under
- 15 Section 25.094 or to referral to a juvenile court in a county with a
- 16 population of less than 100,000 for conduct that violates that
- 17 section.
- 18 (b) A school district shall notify a student's parent if the
- 19 student has been absent from school, without excuse under Section
- 20 25.087, on three days or parts of days within a semester or, if the
- 21 student attends a school operating on a year-round system under
- 22 Section 25.084, within a four-week period. The notice must:
- 23 (1) inform the parent that:
- 24 (A) it is the parent's duty to monitor the
- 25 student's school attendance and require the student to attend
- 26 school; and
- 27 (B) the parent is subject to prosecution under

- 1 Section 25.093; and
- 2 (2) request a conference between school officials and
- 3 the parent to discuss the absences.
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 25.0951, Education Code, is amended by
- 5 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as
- 6 follows:
- 7 (a) Except as provided in Subsection (a-1), if $[\frac{1}{1}]$ a
- 8 student is absent from [fails to attend] school without excuse for
- 9 the amount of time specified under Section 25.094(a-1) [on 10 or
- 10 more days or parts of days within a six-month period in the same
- 11 school year], a school district shall not later than January 15, if
- 12 the absences occur in the fall semester, or not later than June 15,
- 13 <u>if the absences occur in the spring semester</u> [within 10 school days
- 14 of the student's 10th absence]:
- 15 (1) file a complaint against the student or the
- 16 student's parent or both in a county, justice, or municipal court
- 17 for an offense under Section 25.093 or 25.094, as appropriate, or
- 18 refer the student to a juvenile court in a county with a population
- 19 of less than 100,000 for conduct that violates Section 25.094; or
- 20 (2) refer the student to a juvenile court for conduct
- 21 indicating a need for supervision under Section 51.03(b)(2), Family
- 22 Code.
- 23 (a-1) If a student attending a school that operates on a
- 24 year-round system under Section 25.084 is absent from school
- 25 without excuse for the amount of time specified under Section
- 26 25.094(a-1), a school district shall take the action required under
- 27 Subsection (a) within 10 school days of the student's 10th absence.

- 1 SECTION 4. Section 51.03(b), Family Code, as amended by
- 2 Chapters 1150 (H.B. 2015) and 1322 (S.B. 407), Acts of the 82nd
- 3 Legislature, Regular Session, 2011, is reenacted and amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 (b) Conduct indicating a need for supervision is:
- 6 (1) subject to Subsection (f), conduct, other than a
- 7 traffic offense, that violates:
- 8 (A) the penal laws of this state of the grade of
- 9 misdemeanor that are punishable by fine only; or
- 10 (B) the penal ordinances of any political
- 11 subdivision of this state;
- 12 (2) the absence of a child from school for the amount
- of time specified under Section 25.094(a-1), Education Code [on 10
- 14 or more days or parts of days within a six-month period in the same
- 15 school year or on three or more days or parts of days within a
- 16 four-week period from school];
- 17 (3) the voluntary absence of a child from the child's
- 18 home without the consent of the child's parent or guardian for a
- 19 substantial length of time or without intent to return;
- 20 (4) conduct prohibited by city ordinance or by state
- 21 law involving the inhalation of the fumes or vapors of paint and
- 22 other protective coatings or glue and other adhesives and the
- 23 volatile chemicals itemized in Section 485.001, Health and Safety
- 24 Code;
- 25 (5) an act that violates a school district's
- 26 previously communicated written standards of student conduct for
- 27 which the child has been expelled under Section 37.007(c),

- 1 Education Code;
- 2 (6) conduct that violates a reasonable and lawful
- 3 order of a court entered under Section 264.305; [or]
- 4 (7) notwithstanding Subsection (a)(1), conduct
- 5 described by Section 43.02(a)(1) or (2), Penal Code; or
- 6 (8) [(7)] conduct that violates Section 43.261, Penal 7 Code.
- 8 SECTION 5. Section 25.0951(b), Education Code, is repealed.
- 9 SECTION 6. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 10 to conduct that violates Section 25.093 or 25.094, Education Code,
- 11 as amended by this Act, that occurs on or after the effective date
- 12 of this Act. Conduct that violates Section 25.093 or 25.094,
- 13 Education Code, as amended by this Act, that occurs before the
- 14 effective date of this Act is covered by the law in effect at the
- 15 time the conduct occurred, and the former law is continued in effect
- 16 for that purpose. For purposes of this section, conduct occurs
- 17 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the
- 18 violation occurred before that date.
- 19 SECTION 7. This Act applies beginning with the 2013-2014
- 20 school year.
- 21 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
