A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the number of poll watchers who may be appointed and who
- 3 may serve at a particular location during an election.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 33.007, Election Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsections (e) and (f)
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (a) Each appointing authority may appoint not more than <u>one</u>
- 9 watcher [two watchers] for each precinct polling place, meeting
- 10 place for an early voting ballot board, or central counting station
- 11 involved in the election.
- 12 (b) Each appointing authority may appoint not more than
- 13 seven watchers for each main or branch early voting polling place
- 14 involved in the election. Multiple [Not more than two] watchers
- 15 appointed by the same authority may not be on duty at the same early
- 16 voting polling place at the same time.
- 17 (e) Not more than three watchers from all appointing
- 18 <u>authorities combined may serve at the same time at a precinct</u>
- 19 polling place, main or branch early voting polling place, meeting
- 20 place for an early voting ballot board, or central counting station
- 21 involved in an election. Except as provided by Subsection (f), of
- 22 the three watchers at any location:
- 23 (1) one must be appointed by the political party, or by
- 24 a candidate affiliated with the political party, that received the

- 1 greatest number of votes in the most recent gubernatorial election;
- 2 and
- 3 (2) one must be appointed by a political party, or by a
- 4 candidate affiliated with a political party, that received the
- 5 second-greatest number of votes in the most recent gubernatorial
- 6 election.
- 7 (f) If a watcher described by Subsection (e)(1) or (2) has
- 8 not reported for service at a precinct polling place, main or branch
- 9 early voting polling place, meeting place for an early voting
- 10 ballot board, or central counting station involved in an election,
- 11 <u>another watcher may serve instead until:</u>
- 12 (1) a watcher described by Subsection (e)(1) or (2)
- 13 reports for service; and
- 14 (2) the total number of watchers who have reported for
- 15 service at that location is greater than three.
- 16 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
