A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to expanding eligibility for medical assistance to certain
- 3 persons under the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 32, Human Resources Code, is amended by
- 7 adding Subchapter H to read as follows:
- 8 SUBCHAPTER H. EXPANSION OF ELIGIBILITY FOR MEDICAL ASSISTANCE
- 9 Sec. 32.351. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 10 (1) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services
- 11 Commission.
- 12 (2) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
- 13 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
- 14 (3) "Medical assistance expansion group" means the
- 15 category of persons who would not be eligible for medical
- 16 assistance under the eligibility criteria in effect on December 31,
- 17 2013, but who are eligible for that assistance because of the
- 18 requirement of Section 32.352(a).
- 19 (4) "Undocumented immigrant" means a person who:
- 20 <u>(A) is not a citizen or other national of the</u>
- 21 United States; and
- 22 (B) is not lawfully authorized to be present in
- 23 the United States under the Immigration and Nationality Act (8
- 24 U.S.C. Section 1101 et seq.) or other federal law.

- 1 Sec. 32.352. EXPANDED ELIGIBILITY FOR MEDICAL ASSISTANCE
- 2 UNDER PATIENT PROTECTION AND AFFORDABLE CARE ACT. (a)
- 3 Notwithstanding any other law and except as provided in Subsection
- 4 (b) and Section 32.353, the commission shall provide medical
- 5 assistance to all persons who apply for that assistance and for whom
- 6 federal matching funds are available under the Patient Protection
- 7 and Affordable Care Act (Pub. L. No. 111-148) as amended by the
- 8 Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010 (Pub. L. No.
- 9 111-152) to provide that assistance.
- 10 (b) Nothing in this section authorizes the commission to
- 11 provide medical assistance to undocumented immigrants.
- 12 (c) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules regarding
- 13 the provision of medical assistance as required by this section.
- 14 Sec. 32.353. RESTRICTED ELIGIBILITY FOR MEDICAL ASSISTANCE
- 15 UPON CHANGES IN FEDERAL MATCHING FUNDS. (a) Notwithstanding any
- 16 other law, if the federal medical assistance percentage (FMAP) by
- 17 which this state's expenditures under the medical assistance
- 18 program are matched with federal funds that applies with respect to
- 19 persons in the medical assistance expansion group is less than 90
- 20 percent:
- 21 (1) the commission shall notify the Legislative Budget
- 22 Board; and
- 23 (2) beginning on the first day of the month following
- 24 the month in which the federal medical assistance percentage
- 25 becomes less than 90 percent, the commission shall:
- 26 (A) cease providing medical assistance to
- 27 persons in the medical assistance expansion group; and

- 1 (B) reinstate the eligibility criteria for
- 2 medical assistance that existed on December 31, 2013.
- 3 (b) The executive commissioner shall adopt any rules
- 4 necessary to implement any changes in the provision of and
- 5 eligibility criteria for medical assistance required by this
- 6 section.
- 7 Sec. 32.354. REPORT ON EXPANDED ELIGIBILITY FOR MEDICAL
- 8 ASSISTANCE. Not later than December 1 of each year during which the
- 9 commission provides medical assistance to persons in the medical
- 10 assistance expansion group, the commission shall submit a report to
- 11 the Legislative Budget Board, the governor, the lieutenant
- 12 governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, and the
- 13 standing committees of the senate and the house of representatives
- 14 having primary jurisdiction over the medical assistance program
- 15 regarding the effects of expanding eligibility for medical
- 16 <u>assistance under Section 32.352</u>, including the effects on the
- 17 quality and cost of health care provided to recipients of medical
- 18 assistance and other low-income persons.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 32.352, Human Resources Code, as added
- 20 by this Act, applies only to an initial determination or
- 21 recertification of eligibility of a person for medical assistance
- 22 under Chapter 32, Human Resources Code, made on or after January 1,
- 23 2014, regardless of the date the person applied for that
- 24 assistance.
- 25 SECTION 3. As soon as possible after the effective date of
- 26 this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 27 Services Commission shall take all necessary actions to expand

- 1 eligibility for medical assistance under Chapter 32, Human
- 2 Resources Code, beginning January 1, 2014, and in accordance with
- 3 Section 32.352, Human Resources Code, as added by this Act,
- 4 including notifying appropriate federal agencies of that expanded
- 5 eligibility.
- 6 SECTION 4. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 7 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 8 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 9 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 10 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 11 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
