A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the creation of a game animal meat safety task force.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. GAME ANIMAL MEAT SAFETY TASK FORCE. (a) In this
- 5 section, "task force" means the game animal meat safety task force.
- 6 (b) The task force is composed of the following nine
- 7 members:
- 8 (1) the chair of the House Public Health Committee or
- 9 its successor;
- 10 (2) the chair of the Senate Health and Human Services
- 11 Committee or its successor;
- 12 (3) the chairs of the committees of the house and
- 13 senate with primary jurisdiction over parks and wildlife;
- 14 (4) the chairs of the committees of the house and
- 15 senate with primary jurisdiction over agriculture; and
- 16 (5) three members of the public who have demonstrated
- 17 a high level of knowledge on the issue of game animal meat safety,
- 18 one of whom shall be appointed by the governor, one of whom shall be
- 19 appointed by the lieutenant governor, and one of whom shall be
- 20 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.
- (c) The chairs of the house and senate committees with
- 22 primary jurisdiction over agriculture shall serve as co-presiding
- 23 officers of the task force.
- 24 (d) The task force shall:

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- 1 (1) study and examine trends in the commercially
- 2 raised game meat industry in this state, including the current
- 3 regulations and safeguards regarding game meat, and the differences
- 4 in the inspection of game meats compared to the inspection of
- 5 traditional meats, including beef, pork, and poultry; and
- 6 (2) develop a short-term and a long-term commercially
- 7 raised game animal food safety plan to strengthen safeguards for
- 8 commercially raised native and nonnative wildlife game animals.
- 9 (e) A task force member is not entitled to compensation for
- 10 the services provided as a task force member. Subject to
- 11 availability of funds, a task force member may receive
- 12 reimbursement for the member's actual and necessary expenses
- 13 incurred in performing task force duties.
- 14 (f) The task force shall meet at the call of one of the
- 15 co-presiding officers and may hold additional meetings by telephone
- 16 conference call if necessary.
- 17 (g) The task force shall hold at least three public hearings
- 18 in locations selected by the task force to provide interested
- 19 persons an opportunity to appear and speak on any subject relating
- 20 to the powers and duties of the task force.
- 21 (h) Not later than December 1, 2014, the task force must
- 22 submit the short-term and the long-term commercially raised game
- 23 animal food safety plans to the governor, lieutenant governor, and
- 24 speaker of the house of representatives.
- 25 (i) The task force is abolished and this Act expires January
- 26 1, 2015.
- 27 (j) Not later than December 1, 2013, the governor, the

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- 1 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
- 2 representatives shall appoint the members of the task force created
- 3 under this section.
- 4 SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 5 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 6 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 7 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 8 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
