A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the administration of the citrus budwood certification
- 3 program and the creation of the citrus nursery stock certification
- 4 program; providing civil, criminal, and administrative penalties
- 5 and authorizing fees.

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- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 19, Agriculture Code, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 CHAPTER 19. CITRUS BUDWOOD AND CITRUS NURSERY STOCK CERTIFICATION
- 10 PROGRAMS [PROCRAM]
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 19.001, Agriculture Code, is amended to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 19.001. PURPOSE. The purpose of this chapter is to:
- 14 (1) establish a certified citrus budwood program to
- 15 produce citrus trees that are horticulturally sound, are free from
- 16 virus and other recognizable bud-transmissible diseases, and are of
- 17 an assured type of citrus variety;
- 18 (2) <u>establish a certified citrus nursery program for</u>
- 19 citrus nursery stock sold in or into the citrus zone as part of an
- 20 effort to produce citrus trees that are free from pathogens,
- 21 including citrus greening disease, which is spread by the Asian
- 22 <u>citrus psyllid;</u>
- 23 (3) provide standards for foundation groves,
- 24 certified citrus nurseries, and certified citrus nursery trees; and

- 1 (4) [(3)] provide for an advisory council to make
- 2 recommendations on the implementation of the programs [program].
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 19.002, Agriculture Code, is amended by
- 4 adding Subdivisions (1-a), (2-a), (2-b), and (5-a) and amending
- 5 Subdivisions (4) and (5) to read as follows:
- 6 (1-a) "Asian citrus psyllid" has the meaning assigned
- 7 <u>by Section 80.003.</u>
- 8 <u>(2-a) "Certified citrus nursery" means a nursery that</u>
- 9 meets standards required by the department for production of citrus
- 10 <u>nursery stock free from pests of citrus.</u>
- 11 (2-b) "Certified citrus nursery stock" means citrus
- 12 nursery stock propagated from cuttings or by budding, grafting, or
- 13 air-layering and grown from certified citrus budwood that meets
- 14 standards required by the department for assurance of type of
- 15 citrus variety and for freedom from dangerous pathogens.
- 16 (4) "Citrus grower" means a citrus producer growing
- 17 and producing citrus nursery stock for commercial or retail
- 18 marketing purposes.
- 19 (5) "Citrus nursery" means a producer of citrus
- 20 trees $[\tau]$ propagated through the budding or grafting of citrus trees
- 21 using certified citrus budwood.
- 22 (5-a) "Citrus nursery stock" means citrus plants to be
- 23 <u>used in a commercial or noncommercial setting.</u>
- SECTION 4. Section 19.003, Agriculture Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- Sec. 19.003. SCOPE. Except as otherwise provided by this
- 27 chapter, this [This] chapter applies to all citrus nurseries and

- 1 citrus growers.
- 2 SECTION 5. Chapter 19, Agriculture Code, is amended by
- 3 adding Sections 19.0031 and 19.0041 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 19.0031. CITRUS ZONE. The following counties are
- 5 designated as the citrus zone of this state for the purpose of this
- 6 chapter: Brooks, Cameron, Hidalgo, Jim Hogg, Kenedy, Starr,
- 7 Willacy, and Zapata.
- 8 Sec. 19.0041. CITRUS NURSERY STOCK CERTIFICATION PROGRAM.
- 9 (a) The citrus nursery stock certification program is established.
- 10 The department administers the program.
- 11 (b) The department shall accomplish the purposes of the
- 12 program through the certification of nurseries growing or selling
- 13 <u>citrus nursery stock in the citrus zone.</u>
- 14 (c) All citrus nursery stock grown in or sold in or into the
- 15 citrus zone must be grown in a certified citrus nursery.
- 16 (d) The department, in consultation with the advisory
- 17 council, shall set standards for certified citrus nurseries and
- 18 citrus nursery stock certification, and shall inspect citrus
- 19 <u>nurseries and the records of citrus nurseries to ensure that citrus</u>
- 20 nurseries comply with the provisions of the citrus nursery stock
- 21 <u>certification program.</u>
- (e) The department shall provide for an annual renewal of a
- 23 certificate for a certified citrus nursery, including the
- 24 imposition of applicable fees. The department shall renew the
- 25 certificate if the nursery maintains the standards set by the
- 26 department under Subsection (d).
- SECTION 6. Section 19.006, Agriculture Code, is amended to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 19.006. RULES. The department, with the advice of the
- 3 advisory council, shall adopt standards and rules:
- 4 (1) necessary to administer the citrus budwood
- 5 certification program and the citrus nursery certification
- 6 program; [and]
- 7 (2) to regulate the sale of citrus budwood and citrus
- 8 nursery trees as supplies of certified citrus budwood and certified
- 9 citrus nursery trees become available; and
- 10 (3) requiring citrus nursery stock sold into the
- 11 citrus zone to be propagated:
- 12 (A) using certified citrus budwood; and
- 13 <u>(B) in an enclosed structure that:</u>
- (i) is built to specifications as
- 15 <u>determined by department rule; and</u>
- 16 <u>(ii)</u> has a top and sides that are built to
- 17 exclude insects that may transmit citrus pathogens.
- 18 SECTION 7. Sections 19.007, 19.008, 19.009, 19.010, and
- 19.011, Agriculture Code, are amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 19.007. CERTIFICATION STANDARDS. (a) The department
- 21 shall establish:
- 22 (1) the certification standards for genetic purity for
- 23 varieties of citrus budwood by type;
- 24 (2) procedures that must be followed to prevent the
- 25 introduction of dangerous citrus pathogens into budwood stock from
- 26 and in foundation groves;
- 27 (3) procedures for certification of citrus budwood

1 grown in foundation groves; and 2 (4)procedures for certification of citrus nurseries 3 and citrus nursery trees. 4 The department shall establish standards and procedures 5 for: 6 (1)inspecting and testing for diseases, using current technologies in disease diagnosis, and for desirable horticultural 7 8 characteristics of citrus budwood grown in designated foundation groves; 9 (2) certifying citrus budwood and citrus nurseries 10 meeting requirements established under this chapter; 11 maintaining a source of citrus budwood of superior 12 tested varieties for distribution to the citrus industry; 13 14 (4) verifying propagation of citrus varieties and 15 special rootstocks for growers on request, including an inspection of the citrus nursery's books and records; [and] 16 17 (5) maintaining appropriate records required participation in the citrus budwood certification and citrus 18 19 nursery stock certification programs; 20 (6) inspecting citrus nurseries to ensure that the structures in which citrus nursery stock is propagated meet 21 standards set by the department, including standards for: 22 (A) <u>size;</u> 23 24 (B) construction; 25 (C) insect resistance; 26 (D) citrus nursery sanitation;

(E) movement of the citrus nursery stock from one

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- 1 structure to another at the nursery;
- 2 (F) proximity to nearby citrus groves; and
- 3 (G) other standards for the operation of a
- 4 certified nursery as may be required by the department; and
- 5 (7) requiring each citrus nursery to submit source
- 6 tree bud cutting reports to the department not later than the 30th
- 7 day after citrus trees are budded [program].
- 8 Sec. 19.008. APPLYING FOR FOUNDATION GROVE DESIGNATION,
- 9 [AND] BUDWOOD CERTIFICATION, AND CITRUS NURSERY CERTIFICATION. (a)
- 10 A person who desires to operate a foundation grove and produce
- 11 certified citrus budwood for sale to the citrus industry must
- 12 [shall] apply for foundation grove designation and citrus budwood
- 13 certification in accordance with rules adopted by the department.
- 14 (b) A person who desires to operate a citrus nursery to
- 15 propagate citrus nursery stock for sale in or into the citrus zone
- 16 must apply for citrus nursery certification in accordance with
- 17 rules adopted by the department.
- 18 Sec. 19.009. REVOCATION. The department shall establish
- 19 rules regarding the revocation of foundation grove designation,
- 20 [and] citrus budwood certification, and citrus nursery
- 21 <u>certification</u>.
- Sec. 19.010. PROGRAM COST; FEES; ACCOUNT. (a) The
- 23 department shall set and collect fees from persons applying for
- 24 foundation grove designation, [or] citrus budwood certification,
- 25 or citrus nursery certification. The department shall set the fees
- 26 in an amount that recovers the department's costs in administering
- 27 and enforcing the citrus budwood certification program and the

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- 1 citrus nursery certification program. The department may also
- 2 accept funds from the citrus industry or other interested persons
- 3 to cover the costs of administering the programs [program].
- 4 (b) All fees and funds collected or contributed under this
- 5 section shall be deposited to the credit of an account in the
- 6 general revenue fund. Money in the account may be appropriated only
- 7 to the department for the purpose of administering and enforcing
- 8 this chapter.
- 9 Sec. 19.011. STOP-SALE ORDER. (a) If a person offers
- 10 citrus budwood or a citrus nursery tree for sale falsely claiming
- 11 that it is certified, $[ext{or}]$ that it comes from a designated
- 12 foundation grove, or that it comes from a certified citrus nursery,
- 13 or offers citrus budwood $_{\underline{\prime}}$ [$_{\underline{\bullet r}}$] a citrus nursery tree $_{\underline{\prime}}$ or citrus
- 14 nursery stock for sale in violation of rules adopted under this
- 15 chapter, the department may issue a written order to stop the sale
- 16 of that citrus budwood, [ex] citrus nursery tree, or citrus nursery
- 17 stock. A person may not sell citrus budwood, [or] a citrus nursery
- 18 tree, or citrus nursery stock that is subject to a stop-sale order
- 19 under this section until:
- 20 (1) the sale is permitted by a court under Subsection
- 21 (b); or
- 22 (2) the department determines that the sale of the
- 23 citrus budwood, [ex] citrus nursery tree, or citrus nursery stock
- 24 is in compliance with this chapter and rules adopted under this
- 25 chapter.
- 26 (a-1) The department may issue a written order to stop the
- 27 sale of citrus nursery stock from a citrus nursery or to stop the

- 1 operation of all or part of a citrus nursery if a person propagates
- 2 citrus nursery stock in a citrus nursery for sale in or into the
- 3 citrus zone and:
- 4 (1) the person falsely claims that the citrus nursery
- 5 is certified; or
- 6 (2) if the citrus nursery is certified, the person
- 7 <u>fails to comply with the rules adopted under this chapter.</u>
- 8 <u>(a-2) A person may not sell citrus nursery stock out of a</u>
- 9 citrus nursery, or operate a citrus nursery or a part of a citrus
- 10 nursery, that is subject to a stop-sale order under this section
- 11 until:
- 12 (1) the sale is permitted by a court under Subsection
- 13 (b); or
- 14 (2) the department determines that the citrus nursery
- 15 is in compliance with this chapter and rules adopted under this
- 16 <u>chapter.</u>
- 17 (b) The person named in the order may bring suit in a court
- 18 in the county where the citrus budwood, [ex] citrus nursery tree, or
- 19 citrus nursery subject to the stop-sale order is located. After a
- 20 hearing, the court may, as applicable, permit the citrus budwood or
- 21 citrus nursery tree to be sold, or permit the citrus nursery to
- 22 continue operations, if the court finds, as applicable, the citrus
- 23 budwood or citrus nursery tree is not being offered for sale or that
- 24 the citrus nursery is not operating in violation of this chapter.
- 25 (c) This section does not limit the department's right to
- 26 act under another section of this chapter.
- 27 (d) The department shall inspect each citrus nursery in the

- 1 citrus zone not less than once every two months in order to enforce
- 2 this section.
- 3 SECTION 8. Section 19.012(a), Agriculture Code, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 (a) A person commits an offense if the person:
- 6 (1) sells or offers to sell citrus budwood, [ex] a
- 7 citrus nursery tree, or citrus nursery stock falsely claiming that
- 8 it is certified or that it comes from a designated foundation grove
- 9 or a certified citrus nursery;
- 10 (2) uses, for commercial purposes, citrus budwood that
- 11 is required by department rule to be certified and is not certified
- 12 or does not come from a designated foundation grove; [or]
- 13 (3) <u>sells or offers to sell in or into the citrus zone</u>
- 14 citrus nursery stock that has not been propagated in a certified
- 15 <u>citrus nursery;</u>
- 16 (4) operates, in the citrus zone for the propagation
- 17 of citrus nursery stock, a citrus nursery that is not a certified
- 18 citrus nursery or that is not in compliance with this chapter or a
- 19 rule adopted under this chapter;
- 20 (5) operates, outside of the citrus zone for the
- 21 propagation of citrus nursery stock for sale into the citrus zone, a
- 22 <u>citrus nursery that is not a certified citrus nursery or that is not</u>
- 23 <u>in compliance with this chapter or a rule adopted under this</u>
- 24 <u>chapter;</u> or
- 25 (6) fails to comply with an order of the department
- 26 issued under this chapter.
- SECTION 9. Sections 19.013(a) and (c), Agriculture Code,

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- 1 are amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a) A person who violates this chapter, a rule adopted under
- 3 this chapter, or an order adopted under this chapter is liable to
- 4 the state for a civil penalty not to exceed \$500 for each violation.
- 5 Each day a violation continues is a separate violation for purposes
- 6 of civil penalty assessment.
- 7 (c) A civil penalty collected under this section in a suit
- 8 filed by the attorney general shall be deposited to the credit of an
- 9 account in the general revenue fund. A civil penalty collected
- 10 under this section in a suit filed by a county or district attorney
- 11 shall be divided between the state and the county in which the
- 12 county or district attorney brought suit, with 50 percent of the
- 13 amount collected paid to the state for deposit to the credit of an
- 14 account in the general revenue fund and 50 percent of the amount
- 15 collected paid to the county. Funds credited to the account in the
- 16 general revenue fund may be appropriated only to the department for
- 17 purposes of administering and enforcing this chapter and rules
- 18 adopted under this chapter.
- 19 SECTION 10. Section 19.014, Agriculture Code, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- Sec. 19.014. ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTIES. The department may
- 22 assess an administrative penalty under Chapter 12 for a violation
- 23 of this chapter if the department finds that a person:
- (1) sells or offers to sell citrus budwood, [or] a
- 25 citrus nursery tree, or citrus nursery stock falsely claiming that
- 26 it is certified or that it comes from a designated foundation grove
- 27 or a certified citrus nursery under this chapter;

- 1 (2) uses citrus budwood in violation of rules adopted
- 2 under this chapter;
- 3 (3) uses, for commercial purposes, citrus budwood that
- 4 is required by department rule to be certified and is not certified
- 5 or does not come from a designated foundation grove; [or]
- 6 (4) <u>sells or offers to sell citrus nursery stock in or</u>
- 7 <u>into the citrus zone falsely claiming that the citrus nursery stock</u>
- 8 was propagated in a certified citrus nursery;
- 9 (5) operates, in the citrus zone for the propagation
- 10 of citrus nursery stock, a citrus nursery that is not a certified
- 11 citrus nursery or that is not in compliance with this chapter or a
- 12 <u>rule adopted under this chapter;</u>
- 13 (6) operates, outside of the citrus zone for the
- 14 propagation of citrus nursery stock for sale into the citrus zone,
- 15 <u>a citrus nursery that is not a certified citrus nursery or that is</u>
- 16 <u>not in compliance with this chapter or a rule adopted under this</u>
- 17 chapter; or
- 18 (7) fails to comply with an order of the department
- 19 issued under this chapter.
- 20 SECTION 11. Not later than October 1, 2013, the Department
- 21 of Agriculture shall adopt rules to administer Chapter 19,
- 22 Agriculture Code, as amended by this Act.
- 23 SECTION 12. The changes in law made by this Act apply only
- 24 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 25 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 26 covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the
- 27 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of

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- 1 this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of
- 2 this Act if any element of the offense was committed before that
- 3 date.
- 4 SECTION 13. The changes in law made by this Act apply only
- 5 to a violation committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 6 A violation committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 7 covered by the law in effect when the violation was committed, and
- 8 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 9 SECTION 14. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
