The policy may establish disciplinary measures to be 12 imposed for violation of the prohibition and may provide for the 13 14 district to take possession [confiscation] of the telecommunications [paging] device from the student. 15 16 (b) <u>A</u> [The] policy adopted under Subsection (a) may provide for the district to [+ 17 18 [(1)] dispose of, in any reasonable manner, a 19 telecommunications [confiscated paging] device taken from a student [in any reasonable manner] after having provided the 20 student's parent and any [the] company whose name and address or 21 telephone number appear on the device 30 days' prior notice of the 22 23 district's [its] intent to dispose of that device unless the device is reclaimed in accordance with this section before the end of the 24

a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
