BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

7 SECTION 1. Section 303.003, Labor Code, is amended by 8 adding Subsection (b-2) to read as follows:

9 (b-2) In addition to the purposes described by Subsections (b) and (b-1), in each state fiscal biennium, an amount of money 10 from the skills development fund not to exceed five percent of the 11 amount of general revenue appropriated to the skills development 12 fund for that biennium may be used as provided by this subsection. 13 14 Funds available to the commission from other sources may also be used as provided by this subsection. Funds may be awarded under this 15 16 subsection to a public junior college to be used under an agreement with a school district to support courses offered for joint high 17 school and public junior college credit or offered under a college 18 credit career or technical education program that leads to an 19 industry-recognized license, credential, or certificate. 20 Appropriate uses of funds awarded under this subsection include 21 purchasing or repairing necessary equipment for a course and 22 23 developing a course curriculum. A course or program supported

1	(1) have the endorsement of, or a letter of support
2	from, at least one employer in this state; and
3	(2) be targeted to address the needs of high-demand
4	fields or occupations, as identified by the applicable local
5	workforce development board.
6	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
7	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
8	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
9	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
10	Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
