7 SECTION 1. Section 303.003, Labor Code, is amended by

8 adding Subsection (b-2) to read as follows:

9 (b-2) In addition to the purposes described by Subsections

10 (b) and (b-1), in each state fiscal biennium, an amount of money

11 from the skills development fund not to exceed five percent of the

12 <u>amount of general revenue appropriated to the skills development</u>

13 <u>fund for that biennium may be used as provided by this subsection.</u>

14 Funds available to the commission from other sources may also be

15 used as provided by this subsection. Funds may be awarded under this

16 subsection to a public junior college to be used under an agreement

17 with a school district to support courses offered for joint high

18 school and public junior college credit or offered under a college

19 credit career or technical education program that leads to an

20 industry-recognized license, credential, or certificate.

21 Appropriate uses of funds awarded under this subsection include

22 purchasing or repairing necessary equipment for a course and

23 developing a course curriculum. A course or program supported

- 1 (1) have the endorsement of, or a letter of support
- 2 from, at least one employer in this state; and
- 3 (2) be targeted to address the needs of high-demand
- 4 fields or occupations, as identified by the applicable local

- 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
