A court may waive payment of a 7 8 fine or cost imposed on a defendant who defaults in payment if the court determines that: 9 10 (1)the defendant is indigent or is a child as defined by Article 45.058(h); and 11 each alternative method of discharging the fine or 12 (2) cost under Article 43.09 or 42.15 would impose an undue hardship on 13 14 the defendant. 15 SECTION 3. Article 45.041, Code of Criminal Procedure, is amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (b-3) and 16 17 (b-4) to read as follows: Subject to Subsections [Subsection] (b-2) and (b-3), 18 (b) the justice or judge may direct the defendant: 19 20 (1) to pay: 21 (A) the entire fine and costs when sentence is 22 pronounced; the entire fine and costs at some later date; 23 (B) 24 or 25 (C) a specified portion of the fine and costs at 26 designated intervals; if applicable, to make restitution to any victim 27 (2)

The 12 court shall enter the choice in the record and provide a copy to the 13 14 defendant. SECTION 4. Article 45.0491, Code of Criminal Procedure, is 15 amended to read as follows: 16 Art. 45.0491.
