1-18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
1-19	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 8, Health and Safety Code, is
1-20	amended by adding Chapter 696 to read as follows:
1-21	CHAPTER 696. DISPOSITION OF UNCLAIMED CREMATED REMAINS
1-22	Sec. 696.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
1-23	(1) "Verification information" means data required by
1-24	the United States Department of Veterans Affairs to verify whether
1-25	a person is a veteran or a veteran's dependent eligible for burial
1-26	in a veterans cemetery, including a copy of the person's death
1-27	certificate and the person's name, service number, social security
1-28	number, date of birth, date of death, and place of birth.
1-29	(2) "Veterans' service organization" means:
1-30	(A) a veterans' organization that is chartered by
