3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subtitle I, Title 10, Government Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 2165.006.1 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 2165.006.1 DISPLAY OF HONOR AND REMEMBER FLAG. (a) In
7	this section, "Honor and Remember flat" means the Honor and
8	Remember, Inc. flag.
9	(b) The Honor and Remember flag shall be displayed at each
10	state office building on:
11	(1) The third Saturday in May, "Armed Forces Day";
12	(2) the last Monday in May, "Memorial Day";
13	(3) the 14th day in June, "Flag Da";
14	(4) the fourth day of July, "Independence Day";
15	(5) the 11th day of November, "Veterans Day";
16	(6) National POW/MIA Recognition Day;
17	(7) the last Sunday in September, "Gold Star Mother's
18	Day"; and
19	(8) Whenever there is a state military casualty.
20	SECTION 2. The Honor and Remember flag is designated as the
21	symbol of our State's concern and commitment to honoring and
22	remembering the lives of all members of the United States Armed
23	Forces who have lost their lives while serving or as a result of
24	service and their families.

SECTION 3. The Remember 1 Honor and flag's red field represents the blood shed by brave men and women who sacrificed 2 their lives for freedom and the flag's white field and border 3 recognizes the purity of that sacrifice. The flag's blue star is a 4 symbol of active service in military conflict that dates back to 5 6 World War I. The flag's gold star signifies the ultimate sacrifice of a warrior in active service who is not returning home and 7 reflects the value of the life given. The folded flag element 8 highlights this nation's final tribute to a fallen service member 9 and a family's sacrifice. The flag's flame symbolizes the eternal 10 spirit of the departed. 11

SECTION 4. The importance of this legislation and 12 crowded condition of the calendars in both houses create 13 public 14 and an imperative necessity 15 constitutional rule requiring bills to be read on three several 16 days in each house be suspended, and this rule is hereby suspended, and that this Act take effect and be in force from and after its 17 passage, and it is so enacted. 18
