1-19 relating to an exemption from the use of an emergency notification
 1-20 system by certain public service providers.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Section 418.192(h), Government Code, is amended
 1-23 to read as follows:

1-24 (h) The requirements of this section do not apply to:

1-25 (1) a public service provider serving 250,000 or fewer
 1-26 customers; or

1-27 (2) an emergency notification system that is in use by
 1-28 a public service provider on June 1, 2011.

1-29 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
 1-30 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 1-31 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 1-32 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 1-33 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
